THE THIRD BOOK OF MOSÉS, CALLED *LEVITICUS

THE ARGUMENT

As God daily by most singular benefits declared him self to be mindful of his Church: so he would not that they should have any occasion to trust either in them selves, or to depend upon others for lack of temporal things, or ought that belonged to his divine service and religion. Therefore he ordained divers kinds of oblations and sacrifices, to assure them of forgiveness of their offenses, (if they offered them in true faith and obedience). Also he appointed their Priests and Levites, their apparel, offices, conversation and portion: he shewed what feasts they should observe, and in what times. Moreover he declared by these sacrifices and ceremonies that the reward of sin is death, and that without the blood of Christ the innocent Lamb there can be no forgiveness of sins. And because they should give no place to their own inventions (which thing God most detesteth as appeareth by the terrible example of Nadáb and Abihú) he prescribed even to the least things, what they should do, as what beasts they should offer and eat: what diseases were contagious and to be avoided: what order they should take for all manner of filthiness and pollution: whose company they should flee: what marriages were lawful: and what politike laws were profitable. Which things declared, he promised favor and blessing to them that kept his Laws, and threatened his curse to them that transgressed them.

Chapter 1

2 Of burnt offerings for particular persons. 3.10 & 14 The manner to offer burnt offerings aswel of bullocks, as of sheep and birds.

Now the aLord called Mosés, and spake unto him out of the Tabernacle of the Congregation, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and thou shalt say unto them, If any of you offer a sacrifice unto the Lord, ye shal offer your sacrifice of bcattle, as of beves and of the sheep.

- 3 *If his sacrifice *be* a burnt offering of the herd, he shal offer a male without blemish, presenting him of his own voluntary will at the door of the °Tabernacle of the Congregation before the Lord. 4 And he shal put his hand upon the head of the burnt offering and it shalbe accepted ^to *the Lord*, to be his atonement.
- 5 And ^dhe shal kill the bullock before the Lord, and the Priests Aaron's sons shal offer the blood, and shal sprinkle it round about upon the ^ealtar, that is by the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.
- 6 Then shal he flay the burnt offering and cut it in pieces.
- 7 So the sons of Aarón the Priest shall put fire upon the altar, and lay the wood in order upon the fire.
- 8 Then the Priests Aarón's sons shal lay the parts in order, the head and the ^kall upon the wood that is in the fire which is upon the altar.
- 9 But the inwardes thereof and the legs thereof he shal wash in water, & the Priest shal burn all on the altar: *for* it is a burnt offering, an oblation made by fire, for a sweet savor funto the Lord.
- $10\,$ ¶ And if his sacrifice for the burnt offering *be* of the flocks (*as* of the sheep, or of the goats) he shal offer a male without blemish,
- 11 ^gAnd he shal kill it on the Northside of the altar ^hbefore the Lord, and the Priests Aarón's sons shal sprinkle the blood thereof round about upon the Altar.
- 12 And he shal cut it in 'pieces, separating his head and his 'kall, and the Priest shal lay them inorder upon the wood that *lieth* in the fire which is on the altar:
- *Because in this book is chiefly intreated of the Levites, and of things pertaining to their office.
- 1 a Hereby Moses declares that he taught nothing to the people but that, which he received of God.
- 2 b So they could offer of none other sort, but of those which were commanded.
- 3 *Ex. 29.10.
- 3 c Meaning within the court of the Tabernacle.

- 5 d The Priest or Levite.
- 5 e Of the burnt offering, Ex. 27.1.
- 8 ^Or, the body of the beast, or the fat.
- 9 f Or a savor of rest, which pacifies the anger of the Lord.
- 11 g Read verse 5.
- 11 h Before the altar of the Lord.
- 12 ^Ebr., into his pieces.
- 12 ^Or, fat.

- 13 But he shal wash the inwardes, & the legs with water, and the Priest shal offer the whole & burn it upon the altar: *for* it is a burnt offering, an oblation made by fire for a sweet savor unto the Lord. 14 ¶ And if his sacrifice *be* a burnt offering to the Lord of the fowls, then he shal offer his sacrifice of the turtle doves, or of the young pigeons.
- 15 And the Priest shal bring it unto the altar, and wring the neck of it a sunder, and burn it on the altar: and the blood thereof shal be ^shed upon the side of the altar.
- 16 And he shal plucke out his mawe with his feathers, and cast them beside the altar of the *Eastpart in the place of the ashes. 17 And he shal cleave it with his wings, *but* not divide it a sunder: and the Priest shal burn it upon the altar upon the wood that is in the fire: *for* it is a burnt offering, an oblation made by fire for a sweet savor unto the Lord.

Chapter 2

1 The meat offering is after three sorts: of fine flour unbaken, 4 Of bread baken, 14 And of corn in the ear.

And when any wil offer a *meat offering unto the Lord, his offering shalbe of fine flour, and he shal pour oil upon it, and put incense thereon,

- 2 And shal bring it unto Aarón's sons the Priests, and ^bhe shal take thence his handful of the flour, & of the oil with all the incense, & the Priest shal burn it for a ^cmemorial upon the altar: *for* it is an offering made by fire for a sweet savor unto the Lord. 3 *But the remnant of the meat offering *shalbe* Aarón's and his
- sons: for it is dmost holy of the Lord's offerings made by fire.

 4 ¶ If thou bring also a meat offering baken in the oven, it shalbe
- an unleavened cake of fine flour mingled with oil, or an unleavened wafer anointed with oil.
- 5 \P But if thy emeat offering be an oblation of the frying pan, it shalbe of fine flour unleavened, mingled with oil.
- 6 And thou shalt part it in pieces, and pour oil thereon: *for* it is a meat offering.
- 7 ¶ And if thy meat offering *be* an oblation *made* in the cauldron, it shalbe made of fine flour with oil.
- 8 After, thou shalt bring the meat offering (that is made of these things) unto the Lord, and shalt present it unto the Priest, and he shal bring it to the altar,
- 15 i The Ebrewe word signifies to pinch off with the nail.

- 16 k On the side of the court gate in the pans, which stood with ashes, Ex. 27.3.

- 1 a Because the burnt offering could not be without the meat offering.
- 2 b The Priest.
- 2 c To signify that God remembers him that offers.
- 3 *Eccle. 7.31.
- 3 d Therefore none could eat of it but the Priests.
- 5 e Which is a gift offered to God to pacify him.

9 And the Priest shal take from the meat offering a *memorial of it, and shal burn it upon the altar: *for* it is an oblation *made by fire for a sweet savor unto the Lord.

10 But that which is left of the meat offering, *shalbe* Aarón's & his sons: *for it is* most holy of the offerings of the Lord made by fire.

11 All the meat offerings which ye shal offer unto the Lord, shalbe made without leaven: for ye shal neither burn leaven nor honey in any offering of the Lord made by fire.

12 ¶ In the oblation of the first fruits ye shal offer fthem unto the Lord, but they shal not be burnt gupon the altar for a sweet savor.

13 (All the meat offerings also shalt thou season with *salt, neither shalt thou suffer the salt of the covenant of thy God to be lacking from thy meat offering, but upon all thine oblations thou shalt offer salt)

14 If then thou offer a meat offering of thy first fruits unto the Lord, thou shalt offer for thy meat offering of thy first fruits *ears of corn dried by the fire, & wheat beaten out of *the green ears. 15 After, thou shalt put oil upon it, and lay incense thereon: *for* it is a meat offering.

16 And the Priest shal burn the memorial of it, *even* of that that is beaten and of the oil of it with all the incense thereof: *for* it is an offering unto the Lord made by fire.

Chapter 3

1 The manner of peace offerings, and beasts for the same. 17 The Israelites may neither eat fat, nor blood.

A lso if his oblation be a *peace offering, if he wil offer of the drove (whether it be male or female) he shal offer such as is without blemish, before the Lord,

2 And shal put his hand upon the head of his offering, & kill it at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation: & Aarón's sons the Priests shal sprinkle the blood upon the altar round about.

3 So he shal offer bpart of the peace offerings as a sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord, even the *fat that covereth the inwardes, and all the fat that is upon the inwardes.

4 He shal also take away the two kidneys, and the fat that is on them, & upon ^the flanks, & the kall on the liver with the kidneys. 5 And Aarón's sons shal burn it on the altar with the burnt offering, which is upon the wood, that is on the fire: *this is* a sacrifice made by fire for a sweet savor unto the Lord.

6 ¶ Also if his oblation *be* a peace offering unto the Lord out of the flock, whether it be °male or female, he shal offer it without blemish.

7 If he offer a lamb for his oblation, then he shal bring it before the Lord,

8 And lay his hand upon the head of his offering, and shal kill it before the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and Aarón's sons shal sprinkle the blood thereof round about upon the altar.

- 9 After, of the peace offerings he shal offer an offering made by fire unto the Lord: he shal take away the fat thereof, and the rump altogether, hard by the back bone, and the fat that covereth the inwardes, and all the fat that is upon the inwardes.
- 10 Also he shal take away the two kidneys, with the fat that is upon them, and upon the *flanks, and the kall upon the liver with the kidneys.
- 11 Then the Priest shal burn it upon the altar, as the meat of an offering made by fire unto the Lord.
- 12 \P Also if his offering be a goat, then shal he offer it before the Lord,
- 13 And shal put his hand upon the head of it, and kill it before the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and the sons of Aarón shal sprinkle the blood thereof upon the altar round about.
- 14 Then he shal offer thereof his offering, *even* an offering made by fire unto the Lord, the fat that covereth the inwardes, and all the fat that is upon the inwardes.
- 15 Also he shal take away the two kidneys, and the fat that is upon them, and upon the flanks and the kall upon the liver with the kidneys.

16 So the Priest shal burn them upon the altar, as the meat of an offering made by fire for a sweet savor: *all the fat is the Lord's. 17 This shalbe a perpetual ordinance for your generations, through out all your dwellings, so that ye shal eat neither 'fat nor *blood.

Chapter 4

1 The offering for sins done of ignorance, 3 For the Priest, 13 The Congregation, 22 The ruler, 27 And the private man.

Moreover the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, saying, If ^any shal sin through aignorance, in any of the commandments of the Lord (which ought not to be done) but shal do *contrary* to any of them,

3 If the ^bPriest that is anointed do sin (according to the sin of the people) then shal he offer, for his sin which he hath sinned, a young bullock without blemish unto the Lord for a sin offering,

4 And he shal bring the bullock unto the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation before the Lord, and shal put his hand upon the bullock's head, and °kill the bullock before the Lord.

5 And the Priest that is anointed shal take of the bullock's blood, and bring it into the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

6 Then the Priest shal dip his finger in the blood, and sprinkle of the blood seven times before the Lord, before the veil of the danctuary.

7 The Priest also shal put *some* of the blood before the Lord, upon the horns of the altar of sweet incense, which is in the

Chapter 3

- 3 b One part was bumt, another was to the Priests, and the third to him that offered.

6 c In the peace offering it was indifferent to offer either male or female, but in the burnt offering only the male, so here can be offered no birds, but in the burnt offering they might: all there was consumed with fire, and in the peace offering but a part.

Chapter 4

6 d Which was between the Holiest of all and the Sanctuary.

- ^eTabernacle of the Congregation, then shall he pour *all *the rest* of the blood of the bullock at the foot of the altar of burnt offering, which is at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.
- 8 And he shal take away all the fat of the bullock for the sin offering: *to wit*, the fat that covereth the inwardes, and all the fat that is about the inwardes.
- 9 He shal take away also the two kidneys, and the fat that is upon them, and upon the flanks, and the kall upon the liver with the kidneys,
- 10 As it was taken away from the bullock of the peace offerings, and the Priest shal burn them upon the altar of burnt offering.
- 11 *But the skin of the bullock, and all his flesh, with his head, and his legs, and his inwardes, and his dung *shal he bear out*.
- 12 So he shal carry the whole bullock out of the *host unto a clean place, where the ashes are poured, & shal burn him on the wood in the fire: where the ashes are cast out, shal he be burnt.
- 13 ¶ And if the 'whole Congregation of Israél shal sin through ignorance, and the thing be *hid from the eyes of the multitude, and have done *against* any of the commandments of the Lord which should not be done, and have offended:
- 14 When the sin which they have committed shalbe knowen, then the Congregation shal offer a young bullock for the sin, and bring him before the Tabernacle of the Congregation,
- 15 And the ⁹Elders of the Congregation shal put their hands upon the head of the bullock before the Lord, and ^he shal kill the bullock before the Lord.
- 16 Then the Priest that is anointed, shal bring of the bullock's blood into the Tabernacle of the Congregation,
- 17 And the Priest shal dip his finger in the blood, and sprinkle it seven times before the Lord, *even* before the veil.
- 18 Also he shal put *some* of the blood upon the horns of the altar, which is before the Lord, that is in the Tabernacle of the Congregation: then shal he pour all the *rest* of the blood at the foot of the altar of burnt offering, which is at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation,
- 19 And he shal take all his fat from him, & ^bum it upon the altar. 20 And *the Priest* shal do with this bullock, as he did with the bullock for *his* sin: so shal he do with this: so the Priest shal make an atonement for them, and it shalbe forgiven them.
- 21 For he shal carry the bullock without the host, and burn him as he burned the first bullock: *for* it is an offering for the sin of the Congregation.
- 22 ¶ When a ruler shal sin, and do through ignorance against any of the commandments of the Lord his God, which should not be done and shall offend.
- 23 If one shewe unto him his sin which he hath committed, then shal he bring for his offering an ^he goat without blemish,
- 24 And shal lay his hand upon the head of the he goat, and kill it in hthe place where he should kill the burnt offering before the Lord: *for* it is a sin offering.
- 25 Then the Priest shal take of the blood of the sin offering with his finger, and put it upon the horns of the burnt offering altar,

and shal pour *the rest* of his blood at the foot of the burnt offering

- 26 And shal burn all his fat upon the altar, as the fat of the peace offering: so the Priest shal make an atonement for him, concerning his sin, and it shal be forgiven him.
- 27 ¶ Likewise if any of the ^people of the land shal sin through ignorance in doing *against* any of the commandments of the Lord, which should not be done, and shal offend,
- 28 If one shewe him his sin which he hath committed, then he shal bring for his offering ^a she goat without blemish for his sin which he hath committed,
- 29 kAnd he shal lay his hand upon the head of the sin offering, and slay the sin offering in the place of burnt offering.
- 30 Then the Priest shal take of the blood thereof with his finger, and put it upon the horns of the burnt offering altar, and pour all the rest of the blood thereof at the foot of the altar,
- 31 And shal take away all his fat, as the fat of the peace offerings is taken away, and the Priest shal burn it upon the altar for a *sweet savor unto the Lord, and the Priest shal make an atonement for him, and it shalbe forgiven him.
- 32 And if he bring a lamb for his sin offering, he shal bring a female without blemish,
- 33 And shal lay his 'hand upon the head of the sin offering, and he shal slay it for a sin offering in the place where he should kill the burnt offering.
- 34 Then the Priest shal take of the blood of the sin offering with his finger, and put it upon the horns of the burnt offering altar, & shal pour all *the rest* of the blood thereof at the foot of the altar. 35 And he shal take away all the fat thereof, as the fat of the lamb of the peace offerings is taken away: then the Priest shal burnt it upon the altar "with the oblations of the Lord made by fire, and the Priest shal make an atonement for him concerning his sin that he hath committed, and it shalbe forgiven him.

Chapter 5

1 Of him that testifieth not the truth, if he hear another swear falsely. 4 Of him that voweth rashly. 15 Of him that by ignorance withdraweth any thing dedicate to the Lord.

Also if 'any have sinned, *that is*, if 'he have heard the voice of an oath, and he can be a witness, whether he hath seen or aknowen of it, if he do not utter it, he shall bear his iniquity:

- 2 Either if one touch any unclean thing, whether it be a carrion of an unclean beast, or a carrion of unclean cattle, or a carrion of unclean creeping things, and is not ware or it yet he is unclean, and hath offended:
- 3 Either if he touch any uncleanness of man (whatsoever uncleanness it be, that he is defiled with) and is not ware of it, and after commeth to the knowledge of it, he hath sinned:
- 4 Either if any ^bswear, and pronounce with his lips to do evil, or to do good (whatsoever it be that a man shal pronounce with an oath and it be hid from him, and after knoweth that he hath

offended in one of these points,

- 5 When he hath sinned in any of these ^cthings, then he shal confess that he hath sinned therein.
- 6 Therefore shal he bring his trespass offering unto the Lord for his sin which he hath committed, *even* a female from the flock, *be it* a lamb or a she goat for a sin offering, and the Priest shal make an atonement for him, concerning his sin.
- 7 But ^if he be not able to bring a sheep, he shal bring for his trespass which he hath committed, two turtle doves, or two young pigeons unto the Lord, one for a sin offering, and the other for a burnt offering.
- 8 So he shal bring them unto the Priest, who shal offer the sin offering first, and *wring the neck of it a sunder, but not plucke it clean off.
- 9 After he shal sprinkle of the blood of the sin offering upon the side of the altar, and the rest of the blood shal 'be shed at the foot of the altar: for it is a sin offering.
- 10 Also he shal offer the second for a burnt offering ^as the manner is: so shal the Priest dmake an atonement for him (for his sin which he hath committed) and it shalbe forgiven him.
- 11 ¶ But if he *be not able to bring two turtle doves, or two young pigeons, then he that hath sinned, shal bring for his offering, the tenth part of an °Epháh of fine flour for a sin offering, he shal put none foil thereto, neither put any incense thereon: for it is a sin offering.
- 12 Then shal he bring it to the Priest and the Priest shal take his handful of it for the *remembrance thereof, and burn it upon the altar *with the offerings of the Lord made by fire: *for* it is a sin offering.
- 13 So the Priest shal make an atonement for him, as touching his sin that he hath committed in one of these *points*, and it shal be forgiven him: and *the remnant* shalbe the Priest's, as the meat offering.
- 14 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 15 If any person transgress and sin through ignorance ⁹ by taking away things consecrated unto the Lord, he shal then bring for his trespass offering unto the Lord a ram without blemish out of the flock, worth two shekels of silver ^hby thy estimation after the shekel of the Sanctuary, for a trespass offering.
- 16 So he shal restore that wherein he hath offended, *in taking away* of the holy thing, and shal put the fifth part more thereto, and give it unto the Priest: so the Priest shal make an atonement for him with the ram of the trespass offering, and it shalbe forgiven him.
- 17 \P Also if any sin and *do *against* any of the commandments of the Lord, which ought not to be done, and know not and 'sin and bear his iniquity,
- 18 Then shal he bring a ram without blemish out of the flock, in thy estimation worth *two shekels for a trespass offering unto the Priest: & the Priest shal make an atonement for him concerning his *ignorance wherein he erred, and was not ware: so it shal be

forgiven him.

19 This is the trespass offering for the trespass committed against the Lord.

Chapter 6

6 The offering for sins which are done willingly. 9 The law of the burnt offerings. 13 The fire must abide evermore upon the altar. 14 The law of the meat offering. 20 The offerings of Aarón, and his sons.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 If any sin and commit a trespass against the Lord, & deny unto his neighbor that, which was taken him to keep, or that which was put to him of trust, or doeth by brobbery, or by violence oppress his neighbor,

- 3 Or hath found that which was lost, and denieth it, and sweareth falsley, *for any of *these* things that a man doeth, ^cwherein he sinneth:
- 4 When, I say, he thus sinneth and trespasseth, he shal then restore the robbery that he robbed, or the thing taken by violence which he took by force, or the thing which was delivered him to keep, or the lost thing which he found,
- 5 Or for whatsoever he hath sworn falsely, he shal both restore it in the whole *sum, and shal add the fifth part more thereto, *and* give it unto him to whom it perteineth, the same day that he offreth for his trespass.
- 6 Also he shal bring for his trespass unto the Lord, a ram without blemish out of the *flock in thy estimation worth two shekels for a trespass offering unto the Priest.
- 7 And the Priest shal make an atonement for him before the Lord, and it shal be forgiven him, whatsoever thing he hath done, and trespassed therein.
- 8 ¶ Then the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 9 Command Aarón and his sons, saying, This it the dlaw of the burnt offering, (it is the burnt offering because it burneth upon the altar all the night unto the morning, and the fire burneth on the altar)
- 10 And the Priest shal put on his linen garment, and shal put on his linen breeches upon 'his flesh, and take away the ashes when the fire hath consumed the burnt offering upon the altar, and he shal put them beside the 'altar.
- 11 After he shal put off his garments, and put on other raiment, and carry the ashes forth without the host unto a clean place.
- 12 But the fire upon the altar shal burn thereon *and* never be put out: wherefore the Priest shal burn wood on it every morning, and lay the burnt offering in order upon it, and he shal burn thereon the fat of the peace offerings.
- 13 The fire shal ever burn upon the altar, and never go out.
- 14 ¶ *Also this is the law of the meat offering, which Aarón's sons shal offer in the presence of the Lord, before the altar.
- 15 He shal even take thence his handful of fine flour of the meat offering and of the oil, and all the incense which *is* upon the meat offering and shal burn it upon the altar for a sweet savor, *as* a *memorial therefore unto the Lord:
- 16 But the rest thereof shal Aarón and his sons eat: it shalbe eaten without leaven in the holy place: in the court of the

Tabernacle of the Congregation they shal eat it.

17 It shal not be ⁹baken with leaven: I have given it for their portion of mine offerings made by fire: *for* it is as the sin offering and as the trespass offering.

18 All the males among the children of Aarón shal eat of it: It shalbe a statute for ever in your generations concerning the offerings of the Lord, made by fire: *whatsoever toucheth them shalbe holy.

19 ¶ Again the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,

20 This is the offering of Aarón and his sons, which they shal offer unto the Lord in the day when he is anointed: the tenth part of an *Epháh of fine flour, for a meat offering herpetual: half of it in the morning, and half thereof at night.

21 In the frying pan it shalbe made with oil: thou shalt bring it fried, and shalt offer the ^baken pieces of the meat offering for a sweet savor unto the Lord.

22 And the Priest that is ⁱanointed in his stead, among his sons shal offer it: *it is* the Lord's ordinance for ever, it shal be burnt altogether.

23 For every meat offering of the Priest shalbe *burnt* altogether, it shal not be eaten.

24 ¶ Furthermore the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,

25 Speak unto Aarón, and unto his sons, and say, This is the law of the sin offering, In the place where the burnt offering is killed, shal the sin offering be killed before the Lord, *for* it is most holy. 26 The Priest that offereth this sin offering, shal eat it: in the holy place shal it be eaten, in the court of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

27 Whatsoever shal touch the flesh thereof shalbe holy: and when there droppeth of the blood thereof upon a kgarment, thou shalt wash that whereon it droppeth in the holy place.

28 Also the earthen pot that it is sodden in, shalbe broken, but if it be sodden in a brasen pot, it shal both be scoured and washed with water.

29 All the males among the Priests shal eat thereof, *for* it is most holy.

30 *But no sin offering, whose blood is brought in to the Tabernacle of the Congregation to make reconciliation in the holy place, shal be eaten, *but* shal be burnt in the ^mfire.

Chapter 7

1 The law of the trespass offering, 11 Also of the peace offerings 23 The fat and the blood may not be eaten.

Likewise this is the law of the atrespass offering, it is most holy. 2 In the place bwhere they kill the burnt offering, shal they kill the trespass offering, and the blood thereof shal he sprinkle round about upon the altar.

3 All the fat thereof also shal che offer, the rump and the fat that covereth the inwards.

4 After he shal take away the two kidneys, with the fat that is on them & upon the flanks, and the kall on the liver with the kidneys. 5 Then the Priest shal burn them upon the altar, for an offering

made by fire unto the Lord: this is a trespass offering.

6 All the males among the Priests shal eat thereof, it shalbe eaten in the holy place, *for* it is most holy.

7 As the sin offering *is*, so *is* the trespass offering, one ^dlaw serveth for both, ^ethat wherewith the Priest shal make atonement, shalbe his.

8 Also the Priest that offereth any man's burnt offering, shal have the skin of the burnt offering which he hath offered.

9 And all the meat offering that is baken in the oven, and that is dressed in the pan, and in the frying pan, shalbe the Priest's that offereth it.

10 And every meat offering mingled with oil, and that is 'dry, shal pertain unto all the sons of Aarón, to all alike.

11 Furthermore this is the law of the peace offerings, which he shal offer unto the Lord.

12 If he offer it to ⁹give thanks, then he shal offer for his thanks offering, unleavened cakes mingled with oil, and unleavened wafers anointed with oil, and fine flour fried *with* the cakes mingled with oil.

13 He shal offer *also* his offering with cakes of leavened bread, for his peace offerings, to give thanks.

14 And of all the sacrifice he shal offer one *cake* for an heave offering unto the Lord, *and* it shalbe the Priest's that sprinkleth the blood of the peace offerings.

15 Also the flesh of his peace offerings, for thanks giving, shalbe eaten the same day that it is offered: he shal leave nothing thereof until the morning.

16 But if the sacrifice of his offering be a how, or a free offering, it shalbe eaten the same day that he offereth his sacrifice: and so in the morning the residue thereof shalbe eaten.

17 But asmuch of the offered flesh as remaineth unto the third day, shalbe burnt with fire.

18 For is any of the flesh of his peace offerings be eaten in the third day, he shal not be accepted that offereth it, neither shal it be reckoned unto him, *but* shalbe an abomination: therefore the person that eateth of it shal bear his iniquity.

19 The flesh also that toucheth any unclean kthing, shal not be eaten, *but* burnt with fire: but of this flesh all that be clean shall eat thereof.

20 But if any eat of the flesh of the peace offerings that pertaineth to the Lord, having his *uncleanness upon him, even the same person shal be cut off from his people.

21 Moreover when any toucheth any unclean thing, as the uncleanness of man, or of an unclean beast, or of any filthy abomination, & eat of the flesh of the peace offerings, which pertaineth unto the Lord, even that person shal be cut off from his people.

22 ¶ Again the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,

23 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, *Ye shal eat no fat of beves, nor of sheep, nor of goats:

24 Yet the fat of the dead beast, and the fat of that, which is torn *with beasts*, shalbe occupied to any use, but ye shal not eat of it. 25 For whosoever eateth the fat of the beast, of the which he shal offer an offering made by fire to the Lord, even the person that eateth, shal be cut off from his people.

26 Neither *shal ye eat any blood, either of fowl, or of beast in all

your dwellings.

27 Every person that eateth any blood, even the same person shalbe cut off from his people.

28 ¶ And the Lord talked with Mosés, saying,

29 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, He that offereth his peace offerings unto the Lord, shal bring his gift unto the Lord of his peace offerings:

30 His "hands shal bring the offerings of the Lord made by fire: even the fat with the breast shal he bring, that the breast may be *shaken to and fro before the Lord.

31 Then the Priest shal burn the fat upon the altar, and the breast shal be Aarón's and his sons.

32 And the right shoulder shal ye give unto the Priest for an heave offering, of your peace offerings.

33 The same that offereth the blood of the peace offerings, and the fat, among the sons of Aarón, shal have the right shoulder for his part.

34 For the breast shaken to and fro, and the shoulder lifted up, have I taken of the children of Israél, even of their peace offerings, and have given them unto Aarón the Priest and unto his sons by a statute for ever from among the children of Israél. 35 ¶ This is the nanointing of Aarón, and the anointing of his sons, concerning the offerings of the Lord made by fire, in the day when he presented them to serve in the Priest's office unto the Lord.

36 The which portions the Lord commanded to give them in the day that he anointed them from among the children of Israél, by a statute for ever in their generations.

37 This is also the law of the burnt offering, of the meat offering, and of the sin offering, and of the trespass offering, and of the °consecrations, and of the peace offerings,

38 Which the Lord commanded Mosés in the mount Sinái, when he commanded the children of Israél to offer their gifts unto the Lord in the wilderness of Sinái.

Chapter 8

12 The anointing of Aarón, and his sons, with the sacrifice concerning the same.

fterward the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 *Take Aarón Aand his sons with him, and the garments and the *anointing oil, and a bullock for the sin offering, and two rams, and a basket of unleavened bread.

3 And assemble all the company at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

4 So Mosés did as the Lord had commanded him, and the company was assembled at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

5 So Mosés said unto the company, *This is the thing which the Lord hath commanded to do.

6 And Mosés brought Aarón and his sons, and washed them with water,

7 And put upon him the coat, and girded him with a girdle, and clothed his with the robe, and put the Ephód on him, which he girded with the broydred garde of the Ephód, and bond it unto him therewith.

8 After he put the breast plate thereon, and put in the breast plate *the Urim and the Thummim.

9 Also he put the mitre upon his head, and put upon the mitre on the fore front the golden plate, and the aholy crown, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

10 (Now Mosés had taken the anointing oil, and anointed the ^bTabernacle, and all that was therein, and sanctified them,

11 And sprinkled thereof upon the altar seven times, and anointed the altar and all his instruments, and the laver, and his foot, to sanctify them)

12 *And he poured of the anointing oil upon Aarón's head, and anointed him, to sanctify him.

13 After, Mosés brought Aarón's sons, and put coats upon them, and girded them with girdles, and put bonnets upon their heads, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

14 *Then he brought the bullock for the sin offering, and Aarón and his sons put their hands upon the head of the bullock for the

15 And Mosés slew him, and took the blood, which he put upon the horns of the 'Altar round about with his finger, and purified the Altar, and poured the rest of the blood at the foot of the Altar: so he sanctified dit, to make reconciliation upon it.

16 Then he took all the fat that was upon the inwardes, and the kall of the liver and the two kidneys, with their fat, which Mosés burned upon the Altar.

17 But the bullock and his ehide, and his flesh, and his dung, he burnt with fire without the host as the Lord had commanded

18 ¶ Also he brought the ram for the burnt offering, and Aarón and his sons put their hands upon the head of the ram.

19 So Mosés killed it, and sprinkled the blood upon the Altar

20 And Mosés cut the ram in pieces, and burnt the head with the pieces, and the fat,

21 And washed the inwardes and the legs in water: so Mosés burnt the ram every whit upon the Altar: for it was a burnt offering for a sweet savor, which was made by fire unto the Lord, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

22 ¶ *After, he brought the other ram, the ram of consecrations, and Aarón & his sons laid their hands upon the head of the ram, 23 Which Mosés fslew, and took of the blood of it, and put it upon the lap of Aarón's right ear, and upon the thumb of his right hand, and upon the great toe of his right foot.

24 Then Mosés brought Aarón's sons, and put of the blood on the lap of their right ears, and upon the thumbs of their right hands, and upon the great toes of their right feet, and Mosés sprinkled the rest of the blood upon the Altar round about.

25 And he took the fat and the rump, and all the fat that was upon the inwardes, and the kall of the liver, and the two kidneys with their fat, and the right shoulder.

26 Also he took of the basket of the unleavened bread that was before the Lord, one unleavened cake and a cake of oiled bread, and one wafer, & put them on the fat, & upon the right shoulder. 27 So he put *all in Aarón's hands, and in his sons' hands, and shook it to and fro before the Lord.

28 After Mosés took them out of their hands, and burnt them upon the Altar for a burnt offering: for these were consecrations

for a sweet savor which were made by fire unto the Lord.

29 Likewise Mosés took the breast of the ram of consecration and shook it to and fro before the Lord: *for* it was Mosés' *portion, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

30 Also Mosés took of the anointing oil, & of the blood which was upon the Altar, and sprinkled it upon Aarón, upon his garments, and upon his sons, and on his son's garments with him: so he sanctified Aarón, his garments, and his sons, and his son's garments with him.

31 ¶ Afterward Mosés said unto Aarón and his sons, Sethe the flesh at the door of the ⁹Tabernacle of the Congregation, and there *eat it with the bread that is in the basket of consecrations, as I commanded, saying, Aarón and his sons shal eat it,

32 But that which remaineth of the flesh and of the bread, shal ye burn with fire.

33 And ye shal not depart from the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation seven days, until the days of your consecrations be at an end: *for seven days, said the Lord, shal he ^consecrate you.

34 As ^he hath done this day: so the Lord hath commanded to do, to make an atonement for you.

35 Therefore shal ye abide at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation day and night, seven days, and shal keep the watch of the Lord, that ye die not: for so I am commanded.

36 So Aarón and his sons did all things which the Lord had commanded by the hand of Mosés.

Chapter 9

8 The first offerings of Aarón 22 Aarón blesseth the people. 23 The glory of the Lord is shewed. 24 The fire commeth from the Lord.

And in the ^aeight day Mosés called Aarón and his sons, and the Elders of Israél: 2 *Then he said unto Aarón, Take thee a young calf for a ^bsin offering, and a ram for a bumt offering, both without blemish, and bring them before the Lord.

3 And unto the children of Israél thou shalt speak, saying, Take ye an he goat for a sin offering, and a calf, and a lamb both of a year old, without blemish for a burnt offering:

4 Also a bullock, and a ram for peace offerings, to offer before the Lord, and a meat offering mingled with oil: for to day the Lord will appear unto you.

5 ¶ Then they brought that which Mosés commanded before the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and all the assembly drew near and stood before the °Lord.

6 (For Mosés had said, This is the thing, which the Lord commanded that ye should do, and the glory of the Lord shal appear unto you)

7 Then Mosés said unto Aarón, Draw near to the Altar, and offer thy sin offering, and thy burnt offering, and make an atonement for thee and for the people: offer also the offering of the people, and make an atonement for them, as the Lord hath commanded.

8 ¶ Aarón therefore went unto the Altar, and killed the calf of the sin offering, which was for him self.

9 And the sons of Aarón brought the blood unto him, and he dipped his finger in the blood, and put it upon the horns of the Altar, and poured *the rest* of the blood at the foot of the Altar.

10 But the fat and the kidneys and the kall of the liver of the sin offering, he *burnt upon the Altar, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

11 The flesh also and the hide he burnt with fire without the host. 12 After, he slew the burnt offering, & Aarón's sons brought unto him the blood, which he sprinkled round about upon the Altar.

13 Also they brought the burnt offering unto him with the pieces thereof, and the head, and he burnt *them* upon the Altar.

14 Likewise he did wash the inwardes and the legs, and ^fburnt *them* upon the burnt offering on the Altar,

15 ¶ Then he offered the people's offering, and took a goat, which was the sin offering for the people, and slew it, and offered it for sin, as the first:

 $16\,\mbox{So}$ he offered the burnt offering, and prepared it, according to the manner.

17 He presented also the meat offering, and filled his hand thereof, and *beside the burnt sacrifice of the morning he burnt *this* upon the Altar.

18 He slew also the bullock, and the ram for the peace offerings, that was for the people, and Aarón's sons brought unto him the blood, which he sprinkled upon the Altar round about,

19 With the fat of the bullock, and of the ram, the rump, and that which covereth in inwardes & the kidneys, & the kall of the liver. 20 So they laid the fat upon the breasts, and he burnt the fat upon the Altar.

21 But the ⁹breasts and the right shoulder Aarón shook to and fro before the Lord, as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

22 So Aarón lift up his hand toward the people, and blessed them, and ham down from offering of the sin offering, and the burnt offering, and the peace offerings.

23 After, Mosés and Aarón went into the Tabernacle of the Congregation and came out, and blessed the people, *and the glory of the Lord appeared to all the people.

24 *And there came a fire out from the Lord and consumed upon the Altar the burnt offering and the fat: which when all the people saw, they ^gave thanks, and fell on their faces.

Chapter 10

D ut *Nadáb and Abihú the sons of Aarón took either of them his censor, and put fire therein, and put incense thereupon, and offered astrange fire before the Lord, which he had not commanded them.

- 3 Then Mosés said unto Aarón, This is it that the Lord spake, saying, I will be banctified in them that come near me, & before all the people I will be glorified: but Aarón held his peace.
- 4 And Mosés called Mishaél and Elzaphán the sons of Uzziél, the uncle of Aarón, and said unto them, Come near, carry your ^brethren from before the Sanctuary out of the host.
- 5 Then they went, and carried them in their coats out of the host, as Mosés had commanded.
- 6 After, Mosés said unto Aarón and unto Eleazár and Ithamár his sons, °Uncover not your heads, neither rent your clothes, lest ye die, and lest wrath come upon all the people: but let your brethren, all the house of Israél bewail the burning which the Lord hath dkindled.
- 7 And go not ye out from the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation, lest ye die: for the anointing oil of the Lord *is* upon you: and they did according to Mosés' commandment.
- 8 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Aarón, saying,
- 9 Thou shalt not drink wine nor ^strong drink, thou, nor thy sons with thee, when ye come into the Tabernacle of the Congregation, lest ye die: *this is* an ordinance for ever throughout your generations,
- 10 That ye may put difference between the holy and the unholy, and between the clean and the unclean.
- 11 And that ye may teach the children of Israél all the statutes which the Lord hath commanded them by the ^hand of Mosés.
- 12 ¶ Then Mosés said unto Aarón and unto Eleazár and to Ithamár his sons that were left, Take the meat offering that remaineth of the offerings of the Lord, made by fire, and eat it without leaven beside the altar: for it is most holy:
- 13 And ye shal eat it in the holy place, because it is thy duty and thy sons duty of the offerings of the Lord made by fire: for so I am commanded.
- 14 Also *the shaken breast and the heave shoulder shal ye eat in ^a clean place: thou, and thy sons, and thy edaughters with thee: for they are given as thy ^duty and thy son's duty, of the peace offerings of the children of Israél.
- 15 The heave shoulder, and the shaken breast shal they bring with the offerings made by fire of the fat, to shake *it* to and fro before the Lord, and it shalbe thine and thy sons with thee by a law for ever, as the Lord hath commanded.
- 16¶*And Mosés sought the goat that was offered for sin, and lo, it was burnt: therefore he was angry with Eleazár and Ithamár the sons of Aarón, which were ^fleft *alive*, saying,
- 17 Wherefore have ye not eaten the sin offering in the holy place, seeing it is most holy? and *God* hath given it you, to bear the iniquity of the Congregation, to make an atonement for them before the Lord.
- 18 Behold, the blood of it was not brought within the holy place: ye should have eaten *it* in the holy place, *as I commanded.
- 19 And Aarón said unto Mosés, Behold, this day ⁹have they offered their sin offering and their burnt offering before the Lord,

and such things as thou knowest are come unto me: if I had eaten the sin offering to day, should it have been accepted in the sight of the Lord?

20 So when Mosés heard it, he was hontent.

Chapter 11

1 Of beasts, fishes and birds, which are clean, and which be unclean.

After, the Lord spake unto Mosés and to Aarón, saying unto them, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, *These are the beasts which ye ashal eat, among all the beasts that are on the earth.

- 3 Whatsoever parteth the ^bhoof, and is cloven footed, and chaweth the cud among the beasts, that shal ye eat:
- 4 But of them that chew the cud, or divide the hoof only, of them ye shal not eat: as the camel, because he cheweth the cud, and divideth not the hoof, he shalbe unclean unto you.
- 5 Likewise the conie, because he cheweth the cud and divideth not the hoof, he shalbe unclean to you.
- 6 Also the hare, because he cheweth the cud, and divideth not the hoof, he shalbe unclean to you.
- 7 *And the swine, because he parteth the hoof and is cloven footed, but cheweth not the cud, he shalbe unclean to you.
- 8 Of their °flesh shal ye not eat, and their carkeis shal ye not touch: for they shalbe unclean to you.
- 9 ¶ These shal ye eat, of all that are in the waters: whatsoever hath fins and skales in the waters, in the seas, or in the rivers, them shal ye eat.
- 10 But all that have not fins nor skales in the seas, or in the rivers, of all that dmoveth in the waters and of all eliving things that are in the waters, they shalbe an abomination unto you.
- 11 They, I say, shalbe an abomination to you: ye shal not eat of their flesh, but shal abhor their carkeis.
- 12 Whatsoever hath not fins nor skales in the waters, that shalbe abomination unto you.
- 13 ¶ These shal ye have also in abomination among the fowls, they shal not be eaten: *for* they are an abomination, the eagle, and the ^goshauke, and the osprey:
- 14 Also the vulture, and the kite after his kind,
- 15 And all ravens after their kind:
- 16 The ostrich also, and the night crow, and the ^seameawe, and the hawk after his kind:
- 17 The little owl also, and the cormorant, and the great owl.
- 18 Also the 'redshake and the pelican, and the swan:
- 19 The stork also, the heron after his kind, and the lapwing, and the back:
- 20 Also every fowl that creepeth *and* goeth upon all four, such shalbe an abomination unto you.
- 21 Yet these shal ye eat: of every fowl that creepeth, and goeth

22 Of them ye shal eat these, the grashopper after his kind, and the 'solean after his kind, the hargol after his kind, and the hagab after his kind.

23 But all *other* fowls that creep *and* have four feet, they *shalbe* abomination unto you.

24 For by such ye shalbe polluted, whosoever toucheth their carkeis, shalbe unclean unto the evening.

25 Whosoever also ⁹beareth of their carkeis, shal wash his clothes, and be unclean until even.

26 Every beast that hath claws divided, and is 'not cloven footed, nor cheweth the cud, such shalbe unclean unto you: every one that toucheth them, shalbe unclean.

27 And whatsoever goeth upon his paws among all manner beasts that goeth on all four, such shalbe unclean unto you: whoso doeth touch their carkeis shalbe unclean until the even. 28 And he that beareth their carkeis, shal wash his clothes, and

be unclean until the even: *for* such shalbe unclean unto you. 29 ¶ Also these shalbe unclean to you among the things that creep and move upon the earth, the weasel, and the mouse, and the hAfrog, after his kind:

30 Also the rat, and the lizard, and the chameleon, and the stellio, and the mole.

31 These shalbe unclean to you among all that creep: whosoever doeth touch them when they be dead, shalbe unclean until the even.

32 Also whatsoever any of the dead carkeises of them doeth fall upon, shalbe unclean, whether it be vessel of wood, or raiment, or iskin, or sack: whatsoever vessel it be that is occupied, it shalbe put in the water as unclean until the even, and so be purified. 33 But every earthen vessel, whereinto any of them falleth, whatsoever is with in it shal be unclean, and *ye shal break it. 34 All meat also that shalbe eaten, if any *such* water come upon

34 All meat also that shalbe eaten, if any *such* water come upon it, shalbe unclean: and all drink that shalbe drunk in all *such* vessels shalbe unclean.

35 And every thing that their carkeis fall upon, shalbe unclean: the furnace or the pot shalbe broken: *for* they are unclean, and shalbe unclean unto you.

36 Yet the fountains and wells where there is plenty of water shal be clean: but that which *toucheth their carkeises shal be unclean.

37 And if there fall of their dead carkeis upon any seed, which useth to be sowen, it shal be clean.

38 But it any 'water be poured upon the seed, and there fall of their dead carkeis thereon, it shalbe unclean unto you.

39 If also any beast, whereof ye may eat, die, he that toucheth the carkeis thereof shalbe unclean until the even.

40 And he that eateth of the carkeis of it, shal wash his clothes and be unclean until the even: he also that beareth the carkeis of it, shal wash his clothes, and be unclean until the even.

41 Every creeping thing therefore that creepeth upon the earth shalbe an abomination, *and* not be eaten.

42 Whatsoever goeth upon the breast, and whatsoever goeth upon all four, or that hath many feet among all creeping things that creep upon the earth, ye shall not eat of them, for they shalbe abomination.

43 Ye shal not pollute your selves with any thing that creepeth, neither make your selves unclean with them, neither defile your selves thereby ye shal not, I say, be defiled by them,

44 For I am the Lord your God: be sanctified therefore, and be "holy, for I am holy, and defile not your selves with any creeping thing, that creepeth upon the earth.

45 For I am the Lord that brought you out of the land of Egypt, to be your God, and that you should be holy, for I am holy.

46 This is the law of beasts, and of fowls, and of every living thing that moveth in the waters, and of every thing that creepeth upon the earth:

47 That there may be a difference between the unclean and clean, and between the beast that may be eaten, and the beast that ought not to be eaten.

Chapter 12

2 A law how women should be purged after their deliverance.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, When a woman hath brought forth seed, & born a manchild, she shal be unclean "seven days, like as she is unclean when she is put a part for her ^*disease. 3 (*And in the eight day the foreskin of the *child*'s flesh shalbe circumcised)

4 And she shal continue in the blood of her purifying three band thirty days: she shal touch no challowed thing, nor come in to the Sanctuary, until the time of her purifying be out.

5 But is she bear a maid child, then she shalbe unclean two eweeks, as when she hath her disease: and she shal continue in the blood of her purifying three score and six days.

6 Now when the days of her purifying are out, (whether it be for a son or for a daughter) she shal bring to the Priest a lamb of one year old for a burnt offering, and a young pigeon or a turtle dove for a sin offering, unto the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

7 Who shal offer it before the Lord, and make an atonement for her: so she shalbe purged of the issue of her blood this is the law for her that hath born a male or female.

8 But if she ^be not able to bring a lamb, she shal bring two *turtles, or two young pigeons: the one for a burnt offering, and the other for a sin offering: and the Priest shal make an atonement for her: so she shalbe clean.

Chapter 13

2 What considerations the Priest ought to observe in judging the leprosie, 29 The black spot or scab, 47 and the leprie of the garment.

Moreover the Lord spake unto Mosés, and to Aarón, saying, 2 The man that shal have in the skin of his flesh a swelling or a scab, or a white spot, so that in the skin of his flesh a it be like the plague of leprosie, then he shalbe brought unto Aarón the Priest, or unto one of his sons the Priests,

Chapter 13

2 a That it may be suspected to be the leprosy.

- 3 And the Priest shal look on the sore in the skin of *his* flesh: if the hair in the sore be turned into white, and the sore seem to be blower then the skin of his flesh, it is a plague of leprosie: therefore the Priest shal look on him, and ^pronounce him unclean:
- 4 But if the white spot be in the skin of his flesh, and seem not to be lower then the skin, nor the hair thereof be turned unto white, then the Priest shal shut up *him that hath* the plague, seven days.
- 5 After, the Priest shal look upon him the seventh day: and if the plague seem ^to him to abide still, and the plague grow not in the skin, the Priest shal shut him up yet seven days more.
- 6 Then the Priest shal look on him again the seventh day, and if the plague °be dark, and the sore grow not in the skin, then the Priest shal ^pronounce him clean, *for* it is a scab: therefore he shal wash his clothes, and be clean.
- 7 But if the scab grow more in the skin, after that he is seen of the Priest, for to be purged, he shalbe seen of the Priest yet again.
- 8 Then the Priest shal consider, and if the scab ^grow in the skin, then the Priest shal pronounce him dunclean: *for* it is leprosie. 9 ¶ When the plague of leprosie is in a man, he shalbe brought
- 10 And the Priest shal see *him*: and if the swelling *be* white in the skin, and have made the hair white, and there be raw flesh in the swelling.
- 11 It is an old leprosie in the skin of his flesh: and the Priest shal pronounce him unclean, and shal not shut him up, for he is unclean.
- 12 Also if the leprosie ^break out in the skin, and the leprosie cover all the skin of the plague, from his head even to his feet, wheresoever the Priest looketh.
- 13 Then the Priest shal consider: and if the leprosie cover all his flesh, he shal pronounce the plague to be clean, because it is all turned into whiteness, so he shalbe clean.
- 14 But if *there be* raw flesh on him when he is seen, he shalbe unclean.
- 15 For the Priest shal see the raw flesh, and declare him to be unclean: for the raw flesh is 'unclean, therefore it is the leprosie.

 16 Or if the raw flesh change and be turned into white, then he shal come to the Priest,
- 17 And the Priest shal behold him: and if the sore be changed into white, then the Priest shal pronounce the plague clean, *for* it is clean.
- 18 ¶ The flesh also in whose skin there is ^a bile and is healed, 19 And in the place of the bile there be a white swelling, or a white spot somewhat reddish, it shalbe seen of the Priest.
- 20 And when the Priest seeth it, if it appear lower then the skin, and the hair thereof be changed into white, the Priest then shal pronounce him gunclean: *for* it is a plague of leprosie, broken out in the bile.
- 21 But if the Priest look on it and there be no white hairs therein, and if it be not lower then the skin, but be darker, then the Priest

- 6 c As having the skin drawen together, or blackish.
- 6 ^Ebr., shal cleanse him.

- 13 e For it is not that contagious leprosy that infects, but a kind of skirfe, which has not the flesh raw as the leprosy.

- 20 g None were exempted, but if the Priest pronounced him unclean, he was put out from among the people: as appears by Marie (Miriam) the prophetess, Num. 12.14, and by King Ozias, 2 Chron. 26.20.

- shal shut him up seven days.
- 22 And if it spread abroad in the flesh, the Priest shal pronounce him unclean, *for* it is a sore.
- 23 But if the spot continue in his place, and grow not, it is a burning bile: therefore the Priest shal declare him to be clean.
- 24 ¶ If there be any flesh, in whose skin there is an hot burning, and the quick flesh of the burning have a hwhite spot, somewhat reddish or pale,
- 25 Then the Priest shal look upon it: and if the hair in that spot be changed into white, and it appear lower then the skin, it is a leprosie broken out in the burning: therefore the Priest shal pronounce him unclean: *for* it is the plague of leprosie.
- 26 But if the Priest look on it, and there be no white hair in the spot, and be no lower then the *other* skin, but be darker, then the Priest shal shut him up seven days.
- 27 After, the Priest shal look on him the seventh day: if it be grown abroad in the skin, then the Priest shal pronounce him unclean: *for* it is the plague of leprosie.
- 28 And if the spot abide in his place, not growing in the skin, but is dark, it is a *rising of the burning: the Priest shal therefore declare him clean, for it is the drying up of the burning.
- 29 \P If also a man or woman hath a sore on the head or in the beard.
- 30 Then the Priest shal see the sore: and if it appear lower then the skin, and there be in it a small yellow ⁱhair, then the Priest shal pronounce him unclean, *for* it is a black spot, and leprosie of the head or of the beard.
- 31 And if the Priest look on the sore of the black spot, and if it seem not lower then the skin nor have any black hair in it, then the Priest shal shut *up him, that hath* the sore of the black spot, seven days.
- 32 After, in the seventh day the Priest shal look on the sore: and if the black spot grow not, and there be in it no yellow hair, and the black spot seem not lower then the skin,
- 33 Then he shalbe shaven, but the place of the black spot shal he not shave: but the Priest shal shut up him, that hath the black spot, seven days more.
- 34 And the seventh day the Priest shal look on the black spot and if the black spot grow not in the skin, nor seen lower then the *other* skin, then the Priest shal cleanse him, and he shal wash his clothes, and be clean.
- 35 But it the black spot grow abroad in the flesh after his cleansing,
- 36 Then the Priest shal look on it: and if the black spot grow in the skin the Priest shal not *seek for the yellow hair: *for* he is unclean.
- 37 But it the black spot seem to him to abide, and that black hair grow therein, the black spot is healed, he *is* clean, and the Priest shal declare him to be clean.
- 38 ¶ Furthermore if there be many white spots in the skin of the flesh of man or woman,
- 39 Then the Priest shal consider and if the spots in the skin of their flesh be somewhat dark and white withal, it is but a white spot broken out in the skin: *therefore* he is clean.
- 40 And the man whose hair is fallen off his head *and* is bald, is clean.
- 41 And if his head close the hair on the fore part, *and* be bald before, he is clean.
- 42 But if there be in the bald head, or in the bald fore head a white reddish sore, it is a leprosie springing in his bald head, or in his bald forehead.
- 24 h If he have a white spot in that place, where the burning was, and was after healed.
- 28 ^Or, swelling.
- 30 i Which was not wont to be there, or els smaller then in any other part of the body.
- 36 k He shall not care whether the yellow hair be there, or no.
- 41 I By sickness, or any other inconvenience.

- 43 Therefore the Priest shal look upon it, and if the rising of the sore be white reddish in his bald head, or in his bald fore head, appearing like leprosie in the skin of the flesh,
- 44 He is a leper and unclean: *therefore* the Priest shal pronounce him altogether unclean: *for* the sore *is* in his head.
- 45 The leper also in whom the plague is, shal have his clothes "rent, and his head bare, and shal put a covering upon his "lips, and shal cry, *I am* unclean, *I am* unclean
- 46 As long as the disease *shalbe* upon him, he shalbe polluted, *for* he is unclean: he shal dwell alone, *without the camp *shal* his habitation *be*.
- 47 ¶ Also the garment that the plague of leprosie is in, whether it be a woolen garment or a linen garment,
- 48 Whether it be in the warp or in the woofe of linen or of woolen, either in a skin or in any thing made of skin,
- 49 And if the sore be green or somewhat reddish in the garment or in the skin, or in the warp, or in the woofe, or in any thing that is made of °skin, it is a plague of leprosie and shalbe shewed unto the Priest.
- 50 Then the Priest shal see the plague, and shut up *it that hath* the plague, seven days,
- 51 And shal look on the plague the seventh day: if the plague grow in the garment or in the warp, or in the woofe, or in the skin or in any thing that is made of skin, that plague *is* a fretting leprosie and unclean.
- 52 And he shal burn the garment, or the warp, or the woofe, whether it be woolen or linen, or any thing that is made of skin, wherein the plague is: for it is a fretting leprosie, *therefore* it shalbe burnt in the fire.
- 53 If the Priest yet see that the plague prow not in the garment, or in the woofe, or in whatsoever thing of skin it be,
- 54 Then the Priest shal command them to wash the thing wherein the plague is, and he shal shut it up seven days more. 55 Again the Priest shal look on the plague, after it is washed: and if the plague have not changed his ^qcolor, though the plague spread no further, it is unclean: thou shalt burn it in the fire, *for* it is a fret inward, 'whether *the spot* be in the bare place of the whole, or in part thereof.
- 56 And if the Priest see that the plague be darker, after that it is washed, he shal cut it out of the garment, or out of the skin, or our of the warp, or out of the woofe.
- 57 And if it appear still in the garment or in the warp, or in the woofe, or in any thing made of skin, it is a spreading *leprie*: thou shalt burn the thing wherein the plague is, in the fire.
- 58 If thou hast washed the garment or the warp, or the woofe, or whatsoever thing of the skin it be, if the plague be departed therefrom, then shal it be washed sthe second time, & be clean. 59 This is the law of the plague of leprosie in a garment of woolen or linen, or in the warp, or in the woofe, or in any thing of skin, to make it clean or unclean.

Chapter 14

3 The cleansing of the leper, 34 And of the house that he is in.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 *This is the alaw of the leper in the day of his cleansing: that is, he shalbe

brought unto the Priest,

- 3 And the Priest shal go out of the camp, and the Priest shal consider *him*: & if the plague of leprosie be healed in the leper, 4 Then shal the Priest command to take for *him* that is cleansed, two ^sparrows alive and ^bclean, and cedar wood and a scarlet *lace*, and hyssop.
- 5 And the Priest shal command to kill one of the birds over °pure water in an earthen vessel.
- 6 After, he shal take the live sparrow with the cedar wood, and the scarlet *lace*, and the hyssop, and shal dip them and the living sparrow in the blood of the sparrow slain, over the pure water,
- 7 And he shal sprinkle upon him, that must be cleansed of his leprosie, seven times, and cleanse him, and shal det go the live sparrow into the broad field.
- 8 Then he that shalbe cleansed, shal wash his clothes, and shave off all his hair, and wash him self in water, so he shalbe clean: after that shal he come into the host, but shal tarry without his tent seven days.
- 9 So in the seventh day he shal shave off all his hair, *both* his head, and his beard, and his eye brows: even all his hair shal he shave, and shal wash his clothes and shal wash his flesh in water, so he shalbe clean.
- 10 Then in the eight day he shal take two he lambs without blemish, and an ewe lamb of an year old without blemish, and three tenth deals of fine flour for a meat offering, mingled with oil, and a pint of oil.
- 11 And the Priest that maketh him clean shal bring the man which is to be made clean, and those things, before the Lord, at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.
- 12 Then the Priest shal take one lamb, and offer him for a trespass offering, and the pint of oil, and *shake them to and fro before the Lord.
- 13 And he shal kill the lamb in the place where sin offering and the burnt offering are slain, *even* in the holy place: for as the *sin offering is the Priest's, *so* is the trespass offering: *for* it is most holy.
- 14 So the Priest shal take of the blood of the trespass offering, and put it upon the lap of the right ear of him that shalbe cleansed, and upon the thumb of his right hand, and upon the great toe of his right foot.
- 15 The Priest shal also take of the pint of oil, and pour it into the palm of his left hand,
- 16 And the Priest shal dip his 'right finger in the oil that is in his left hand, and sprinkle of the oil with his finger seven times before the Lord.
- 17 And of the rest of the oil that is in his hand, shal the Priest put upon the lap of the right ear of him that is to be cleansed, and upon the thumb of his right hand, and upon the great toe of his right foot, ^where the blood of the trespass offering was put.
- 18 But the remnant of the oil that is in the Priest's hand, he shal pour upon the head of him that is to be cleansed: so the Priest shal make an atonement for him before the Lord.
- 19 And the Priest shal offer the sin offering and make an atonement for him that is to be cleansed of his uncleanness: then after shal he kill the burnt offering.
- 20 So the Priest shal offer the burnt offering and the meat

offering upon the altar: and the Priest shal make an atonement for him: so he shal be clean.

21 But if he be poor, and 'not able, then he shal bring one lamb for a trespass offering to be shaken, for his reconciliation, and a ⁹tenth deal of fine flour mingled with oil, for a meat offering, with a pint of oil.

22 Also two turtle doves, or two young pigeons, as he is able, whereof the one shalbe a sin offering, and the other a burnt offering.

23 And he shal bring them the eight day for his cleansing unto the Priest at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation before the Lord.

24 Then the Priest shal take the lamb of the trespass offering, and the pint of oil, and the Priest shal hake them to and fro before the Lord.

25 And he shal kill the lamb of the trespass offering, and the Priest shal take of the blood of the trespass offering, and put it upon the lap of his right ear that is to be cleansed, and upon the thumb of his right hand, and upon the great toe of his right foot. 26 Also the Priest shal pour of the oil into the palm of his own 'left hand.

27 So the Priest shal with his right finger sprinkle of the oil that is in his left hand, seven times before the Lord.

28 Then the Priest shal put of the oil that is in his hand, upon the lap of the right ear of him that is to be cleansed, and upon the thumb of his right hand, and upon the great toe of his right foot: upon the place ^of the blood of the trespass offering.

29 But the rest of the oil that is in the Priest's hand, he shal put upon the head of him that is to be cleansed, to make an atonement for him before the Lord.

30 Also he shal present one of the turtle doves, or of the young pigeons, ias he is able:

31 Such, I say, as he is able, the one for a sin offering, and the other for a burnt offering \(^{\text{with the meat offering:}}\) so the Priest shal make an atonement for him that is to be cleansed before the Lord.

32 This is the ^klaw of him which hath the plague of leprosie, who is not able in his cleansing *to offer the whole.*

33 ¶ The Lord also spake unto Mosés and to Aarón, saying,

34 When ye be come unto the land of Canáan which I give you in possession, if I send the plague of leprosie in an house of the land of your possession,

35 Then he that oweth the house, shal come and tel the Priest, saying, Me think there is like a plague of leprosie in the house. 36 Then the Priest shal command them to empty the house before the Priest go into it to see the plague, that all that is in the house be not made unclean, and then shal the Priest go in to see the house.

37 And he shal mark the plague: and if the plague be in the walls of the house, and that there be ^deep spots, greenish or reddish, which seem to be lower then the wall,

38 Then the Priest shal go out of the house to the door of the house, and shal cause to shut up the house seven days.

39 So the Priest shal come again the seventh day: and if he see that the plague be increased in the walls of the house,

40 Then the Priest shal command them to take away the stones

wherein the plague is, and they shal cast them into a ^foul place without the city.

41 Also he shal cause to scrape the house within round about, and pour the dust, that they have pared off, without the city in "an unclean place.

42 And they shal take other stones, & put them in the places of those stones, & shal take other mortar, to plaster the house with. 43 But if the plague come again and break out in the house, after that he hath taken away the stones, and after that he hath scraped and plastered the house,

44 Then the Priest shal come and see: and if the plague grow in the house, it is a freating leprosie in the house: it is *therefore* unclean.

45 And he shal "break down the house, with the stones of it, and the timber thereof, and all the 'mortar of the house, and he shal carry them out of the city unto an unclean place.

46 Moreover he that goeth into the house all the while that it is shut up, he shalbe unclean until the even.

47 He also that slepeth in the house shal wash his clothes: he likewise that eateth in the house, shal wash his clothes.

48 But if the Priest shal come and see, that the plague hath spread no further in the house, after the house be plastered, the Priest shal pronounce that house clean, for the plague is healed. 49 Then shal he take to purify the house, two sparrows, and cedar wood, °and scarlet *lace*, and hyssop.

50 And he shal kill one sparrow over pure water in an earthen vessel,

51 And shal take the cedar wood, & the hyssop, and the scarlet *lace* with the live sparrow, and dip them in the blood of the slain sparrow, & in the pure water, & sprinkle the house seven times: 52 So shal he cleanse the house with the blood of the sparrow and with the pure water, and with the live sparrow, and with the cedar wood, and with the hyssop, and with the scarlet *lace*.

53 Afterward he shall et go the live sparrow out of the ^town into the ^broad fields: so shall he make atonement for the house, and it shalbe clean.

54 This is the law for every plague of leprosie and *black spot, 55 And of the leprosie of the garment, and of the house,

56 And of the 'swelling, and of the scab, and of the white spot. 57 This is the law of the leprosie to teach 'when a thing is unclean, and when it is clean.

Chapter 15

2.19 The manner of purging the unclean issues both of men and women. 31 The children of Israél must be separate from all uncleanness.

Moreover the Lord spake unto Mosés, and to Aarón, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say unto them, Whosoever hath an issue from his aflesh, is unclean, because of his issue.

3 And this shalbe his uncleanness in his issue: when his flesh

Chapter 15

- 4 Every bed whereon he lieth that hath the issue, shalbe unclean, and every thing whereon he sitteth, shalbe unclean.
- 5 Whosoever also toucheth his bed, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shalbe unclean until the even.
- 6 And he that sitteth on any thing, whereon he sat that hath the issue, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shal be unclean until the even.
- 7 Also he that toucheth the flesh of him that hath the issue, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shalbe unclean until the even.
- 8 If he also, that hath the issue, spit upon him that is clean, ^che shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shal be unclean until the even.
- 9 And what daddle soever he rideth upon, that hath the issue, shalbe unclean.
- 10 And whosoever toucheth any thing that was under him, shalbe unclean unto the even: and he that beareth those *things*, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shal be unclean until the even.
- 11 Likewise whomsoever he toucheth that hath the issue (and hath not washed his hands in water) shal wash his clothes and wash him self in water, and shal be unclean until the even.
- 12 *And the vessel of earth that he toucheth, which hath the issue, shalbe broken: and every vessel of wood shalbe rinsed in water.
- 13 But if he that hath an issue, be °cleansed of his issue, then shal he count him seven days for his cleansing, and wash his clothes, and wash his flesh in pure water: so shal he be clean.
- 14 Then the eight day he shal take unto him two turtle doves or two young pigeons, and come before the Lord at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and shal give them unto the Priest.
- 15 And the Priest shal make of the one of them a sin offering, and of the other a burnt offering: so the Priest shal make an atonement for him before the Lord, for his issue.
- 16 Also if any man's issue of seed depart from him, he shal wash all his 'flesh in water, and be unclean until the even.
- 17 And every garment, and every skin whereupon shalbe issue of seed, shalbe even washed with water, and be unclean unto the even.
- 18 If he that hath an issue of seed, do lie with a woman, they shal both wash them selves with water, and be unclean until the even.
- 19 ¶ Also when a woman shall have an issue, and her issue in her ^flesh shalbe blood, she shalbe put apart seven days: and whosoever toucheth her, shalbe unclean unto the even.
- 20 And whatsoever she lieth upon in ⁹her separation, shalbe unclean, and every thing that she sitteth upon, shalbe unclean.
- 21 Whosoever also toucheth her bed, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self with water, and shal be unclean unto the even.
- 22 And whosoever toucheth any thing that she sat upon, shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shalbe unclean unto the even:
- 23 So that whether he touch her bed, or any thing whereon she hath sit, he shalbe unclean unto the even.
- 24 And is a man lie with her, and the floures of her separation
- 3 b Or the thing wherefore he shall be unclean.
- 8 c On whom the unclean man spat.
- 9 d The word signifies every thing whereon a man rides.

- ^htouch him, he shal be unclean seven days, and all the whole bed whereon he lieth, shalbe unclean.
- 25 Also when a woman's issue of blood runneth long time besides the time of her floures, or when she hath an issue, longer then her floures, all the days of the issue of her uncleanness she shalbe unclean, as in the time of her floures.
- 26 Every bed whereon she lieth (as long as her issue lasteth) shalbe to her as her bed of her separation: and whatsoever she sitteth upon, shalbe unclean, as her uncleanness when she is put apart.
- 27 And whosoever toucheth these *things*, shalbe unclean, and shal wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and shalbe unclean unto the even.
- 28 But if she be cleansed of her issue, then she shal *count her seven days, and after, she shalbe clean.
- 29 And in the eight day she shal take unto her two turtles or two young pigeons, and bring them unto the Priest at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.
- 30 And the Priest shal make of the one a sin offering, and of the other a burnt offering, and the Priest shal make an atonement for her before the Lord, for the issue of her uncleanness.
- 31 Thus shal ye 'separate the children of Israél from their uncleanness, that they die not in their uncleanness, if they defile my Tabernacle that is among them.
- 32 This is the law of him that hath an issue, and of him from whom goeth an issue of seed whereby he is defiled:
- 33 Also of her that is sick of her floures, and of him that hath a running issue, whether it be man or woman, and of him that lieth with her which is unclean.

Chapter 16

urthermore the Lord spake unto Mosés, *after the death of the two sons of Aarón, when they came *to offer* before the Lord, and died:

- 2 And the Lord said unto Mosés, Speak unto Aarón thy brother, *that he come not at *all times in to the Holy place within the veil, before the Merciseat, which is upon the Ark, that he die not: for I will appear in the cloud upon the Merciseat.
- 3 After this *sort* shal Aarón come into the Holy place: *even* with a young bullock for a sin offering, and a ram for a burnt offering. 4 He shal put on the holy linen coat, and shal have linen breeches upon his 'flesh, and shalbe girded with a linen girdle, and shal cover his head with a linen mitre: these are the holy garments: therefore shal he wash his flesh in water, when he doeth put them on.
- 5 And he shal take of the Congregation of the children of Israél, two he goats for a sin offering, and a ram for a burnt offering.
- 6 Then Aarón shal offer the bullock for his sin offering, *and

make an atonement for him self, and for his house.

7 And he shal take the two he goats, and present them before the Lord at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation.

8 Then Aarón shal cast lots over the two he goats: one lot for the Lord, and the other for the ^bScape goat.

9 And Aarón shal offer the goat, upon which the Lord's lot shal fall, and make him a sin offering.

10 But the goat, on which the lot shal fall to be the Scape goat, shalbe presented alive before the Lord, to make reconciliation by him, *and* to let him go (as a Scape goat) into the wilderness.

11 Thus Aarón shal offer the bullock for his sin offering, and make a reconciliation for him self, and for his house, and shal kill the bullock for his sin offering.

12 And he shal take a censor full of burning coals from off the Altar before the Lord, and his handful of sweet incense beaten small, and bring it within the °veil,

13 And shal put the incense upon the fire before the Lord, that the ^cloud of the incense may cover the Merciseat that is upon ^the Testimony: so he shal not die.

14 And he shal *take of the blood of the bullock, *and sprinkle it with his finger upon the Merciseat dEastward: & before the Merciseat shal he sprinkle of the blood with his finger seven times.

15 ¶ Then shal he kill the goat that is the people's sin offering, and bring his blood within the veil, and do with that blood, as he did with the blood of the bullock, and sprinkle it upon the Merciseat, and before the Merciseat.

16 So he shal purge the Holy place from the uncleanness of the children of Israél, and from their trespasses of all their sins: so shal he do also for the Tabernacle of the Congregation *placed with them, in the middes of their uncleanness.

17 *And there shal be no man in the Tabernacle of the Congregation, when he goeth in to make an atonement in the Holy place, until he come out, and have made an atonement for him self, & for his household, & for all the Congregation of Israél.

18 After, he shal go out unto the 'Altar that is before the Lord, and make a reconciliation upon it, and shal take of the blood of the bullock, and of the blood of the goat, and put it upon the horns of the Altar round about:

19 So shal he sprinkle of the blood upon it with his finger seven times, and cleanse it, and hallow it from the uncleanness of the children of Israél.

20 ¶ When he hath made an end of purging the Holy place, and the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and the altar, then he shal bring the live goat:

21 And Aarón shal put both his hands upon the head of the live goat, and confess over him all the iniquities of the children of Israél, and all their trespasses, in all their sins, putting them gupon the head of the goat, and shal send him away (by the hand of a man appointed) into the wilderness.

22 So the goat shal bear upon him all their iniquities into ^the land that is not inhabited, and he shal let the goat go into the wilderness.

23 After, Aarón shal come into the Tabernacle of the Congre-

gation, and put off the linen clothes, which he put on when he went into the Holy place, and leave them there.

24 He shal wash also his flesh with water in the Holy place, and put on his own raiment, and come out, and make his burnt offering, and the burnt offering of the people, and make an atonement for him self, and for the people.

25 Also the fat of the sin offering shall he burn upon the Altar. 26 And he that carried forth the goat, *called* the Scape goat, shal wash his clothes, and wash his flesh in water, and after that shal come into the host.

27 Also the bullock for the sin offering, and the goat for the sin offering (whose blood was brought to make a reconciliation in the Holy place) shal one *carry out without the host to be burnt in the fire, with their skins, and with their flesh, and with their dung.

28 And he that burneth them shal wash his clothes, and wash his flesh in water, and afterward come into the host.

29 ¶ So this shalbe an ordinance for ever unto you: the tenth *day* of the ⁱseventh month, ye shal ^khumble your souls, and do no work at all, whether it be one of the same country or a stranger that sojourneth among you.

30 For that *day shal the Priest make an atonement for you to cleanse you: ye shal be clean from all your sins before the Lord. 31 This shalbe a Sabbath of rest unto you, and ye shal humble your souls, by an ordinance for ever.

32 And the Priest "whom he shal anoint, and whom he shal consecrate (to minister in his father's stead) shal make the atonement, and shal put on the linen clothes & holy vestments. 33 And shal purge the holy Sanctuary and the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and shal cleanse the Altar, & make an atonement for the Priests and for all the people of the Congregation.

34 And this shalbe an everlasting ordinance unto you, to make an atonement for the children of Israél for all their sons *once a year: and as the Lord commanded Mosés, he did.

Chapter 17

4 All sacrifices must be brought to the door of the Tabernacle 7 To devils may they not offer 10 They may not eat blood.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto Aarón, and to his sons, and to all the children of Israél, & say unto them, This is the thing which the Lord hath acommanded, saying, 3 Whosoever he be of the house of Israél that killeth a bullock, or lamb, or goat in the host, or that killeth it out of the host, 4 And bringeth it not unto the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation to offer an offering unto the Lord before the Tabernacle of the Lord, blood shalbe imputed unto that man: he hath shed blood, wherefore that man shalbe cut off from among his people. Therefore the children of Israél shal bring their offerings, which they would offer dabroad in the field, and present them unto the Lord at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation by the Priest, and offer them for peace offerings unto the Lord.

6 Then the Priest shal sprinkle the blood upon the altar of the

Lord before the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation, and burn the fat for a *sweet savor unto the Lord.

- 7 And they shal no more offer their offerings unto ^edevils, after whom they have gone a ^fwhoring: this shalbe an ordinance for ever unto them in their generations.
- 8 ¶ Also thou shalt say unto them, Whosoever *he be* of the house of Israél, or of the strangers which sojourn among them, that offereth a burnt offering or sacrifice,
- 9 And bringeth it not unto the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation to offer it unto the Lord, even that man shal be cut off from his people.
- 10 ¶ Likewise whosoever *he be* of the house of Israél or of the strangers that sojourn among them, that eateth any blood, I will even set ⁹my face against that person that eateth blood, and will cut him off from among his people:
- 11 For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it unto you to offer upon the altar, to make an atonement for your souls: for this blood shall make an atonement for the soul.
- 12 Therefore I said unto the children of Israél, None of you shal eat blood: neither the stranger that sojourneth among you, shal eat blood.
- 13 Moreover whosoever *he be* of the children of Israél, or of the strangers that sojourn among them, which by hunting taketh any beast or fowl that may be heaten, he shal pour out the blood thereof, and cover it with dust:
- 14 For the life of all flesh is his blood, it is *joined* with his life: therefore I said unto the children of Israél, *Ye shal eat the blood of no ^flesh: for the life of all flesh is the blood thereof: whosoever eateth it, shal be cut off.
- 15 And every person that eateth it which dyeth *alone*, or that which is torn *with beasts*, whether it be one of the same country or a stranger, he shal both wash his clothes, and wash him self in water, and be unclean unto the even: after he shalbe ^clean. 16 But if he wash *them* not, nor wash his ^flesh, then he shal bear ^his iniquity.

Chapter 18

3 The Israelites ought not to follow the manners of the Egyptians and Canaanites 6 The marriages that are unlawful.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, & say unto them, I am the Lord your God. 3 After the adoings of the land of Egypt, wherein ye dwelt, shal ye not do: and after the manner of the land of Canáan, whither I will bring you, shal ye not do, neither walk in their ordinances,

- 4 But do after my judgements, and keep mine ordinances, to walk therein: I am the Lord your God.
- 5 Ye shal keep therefore my statutes, and my judgements, *which if a man do, he shal then live in them: bl am the Lord.
- 6 ¶ None shal come near to any of the kindred of his flesh to °uncover *her* shame: I am the Lord.

- 23 *Thou shalt not also lie with any beast to be defiled therewith, neither shal any woman stand before a beast, to lie down thereto: *for* it is ^abomination.
- 24 Ye shal not defile your selves in any of these things: for in all these the nations are defiled, which I will cast out before you:

27 (For all these abominations have the men of the land done, which were before you, and the land is defiled:

28 And shal not the land spue you out if ye defile it, as it "spued out the people that were before you?)

29 For whosoever shal commit any of these abominations, the persons that do so, shal pbe cut off from among their people.

30 Therefore shal ye keep mine ordinances that ye do not any of the abominable customs, which have been done before you, and that ye defile not your selves therein: for I am the Lord your God.

Chapter 19

1 The repetition of sundry laws and ordinances.

nd the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto all the Congregation of the children of Israél, and say unto them, *Ye shalbe aholy, for I the Lord your God am holy.

3 ¶ Ye shal fear every man his mother and his father, and shal keep my Sabbaths: for I am the Lord your God.

9 ¶ *When ye reap the harvest of your land, ye shal not reap every corner of your field, neither shalt thou gather the 'gleanings of thy harvest.

10 Thou shalt not gather the grapes of thy vineyard clean, neither gather every grape of thy vineyard, but thou shalt leave them for the poor and for the stranger: I am the Lord your God.

11 ¶ Ye shal not steal, neither deal falsely, neither lie one to another.

12 ¶ *Also ye shal not swear by my Name falsely, neither shalt thou defile the Name of thy God: I am the Lord.

13 ¶ Thou shalt not do thy neighbor ^wrong, neither rob him.*The workman's hire shal not abide with thee until the morning

15 ¶ Ye shal not do unjustly in judgement. *Thou shalt not favor the person of the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty, but thou shalt judge thy neighbor justly.

16 ¶ Thou shalt not "walk about with tales among thy people. Thou shalt not fstand against the blood of thy neighbor: I am the

17 ¶ Thou shalt not hate thy brother in thine heart, but thou shalt plainly rebuke thy neighbor, ^and suffer him not to sin.

18 ¶ Thou shalt not avenge, nor be mindful of wrong against the children of thy people, *but shalt love thy neighbor as thy self: I am the Lord.

19 ¶ Ye shal keep mine ordinances. Thou shalt not let thy cattle gender with gothers of divers kindes. Thou shalt not sow thy field with mingled seed, neither shal a garment of divers things, as of linen and woolen come upon thee.

20 ¶ Whosoever also lieth and medleth with a woman that is a bond maid, affianced to a husband, and not redeemed, nor freedom given her, ^she shalbe scourged, but they shal not die, because she is not made free.

21 And he shal bring for his trespass offering unto the Lord, at the door of the Tabernacle of the Congregation, a ram for a trespass offering.

22 Then the Priest shal make an atonement for him with the ram of the trespass offering before the Lord, concerning his sin which he hath done, and pardon shalbe given him for his sin which he hath committed.

23 ¶ Also when ye shal come into the land, and have planted every tree for meat, ye hshal count the fruit thereof as uncircumcised: three year shal it be uncircumcised unto you, it shal not be eaten:

24 But in the fourth year all the fruit thereof shal be holy to the praise of the Lord.

25 And in the fifth year shal ye eat of the fruit of it that it may ^yield to you the increase thereof: I am the Lord your God.

26 ¶ Ye shal not eat the flesh with the blood, ye shal not use witch craft, nor observe times.

27 *Ye shal not kcut round the corners of your heads, neither shalt thou mar the tufts of thy beard.

28 *Ye shal not cut your flesh for the ^dead, nor make any print of a mark upon you: I am the Lord.

29 ¶ Thou shalt not make thy daughter common, to cause her to be a mwhore, lest the land also fall to whoredom and the land be full of wickedness.

30 ¶ Ye shal keep my Sabbaths and reverence my Sanctuary: I am the Lord.

31 ¶ Ye shal not regard them that work with spirits, *neither sothesaiers: ye shal not seek to them to be defiled by them: I am the Lord your God.

32 ¶ Thou shalt rise up before the horehed, and honor the

33 ¶ And if a stranger sojourn with thee in your land, ye shal not ^vex him.

- 34 *But the stranger that dwelleth with you, shalbe as one of your selves, and thou shalt love him as thy self: for ye were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.
- 35 ¶ Ye shal not do unjustly in judgement, in oline, in weight, or
- 36 *You shal have just balances, true weights, a true PEpháh, and a true Hin. I am the Lord your God, which have brought you out of the land of Egypt.
- 37 Therefore shal ye observe all mine ordinances, and all my judgements, and do them: I am the Lord.

Chapter 20

2 They that give of their seed to Mólech, must die. 6 They that have recourse to sorcerers. 10 The man that committeth adultery. 11 Incest, or fornication with the kindred or affinity. 24 Israél a peculiar people to the Lord.

nd the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Thou shalt say also A to the children of Israél, *Whosoever he be of the children of Israél, or of the strangers that dwell in Israél, that giveth his children unto aMólech, he shal die the death, the people of the land shal stone him to death.

- 3 And I bwill set my face against that man and cut him off from among his people, because he hath given his children unto Mólech, for to defile my Sanctuary, & to pollute mind holy Name. 4 And if the people of the land hide their eyes, and wink at that man when he giveth his children unto Mólech, and kill him not, 5 Then will I set my face against that man, and against his family, and will cut him off, and all that go a whoring after him to commit whoredom with Mólech, from among their people.
- 6 ¶ If any turn after such as work with spirits, and after sothesaiers, to go a dwhoring after them, then will I set my face against that person, and will cut him off from among his people. 7 ¶ Sanctify your selves therefore, *and be holy, for I am the Lord your God.
- 8 Keep ye therefore mine ordinances, and do them. I am the Lord which doeth sanctify you.
- 9 ¶ *If there be any that curseth his father or his mother, he shall die the death: seeing he hath cursed his father and his mother, ehis blood shalbe upon him.
- 10 ¶ *And the man that committeth adultery with another man's wife, because he hath committed adultery with his neighbor's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress shal die the death.
- 11 And the man that lieth with his father's wife, because he hath uncovered his father's *shame, they shal both die: their blood shal be upon them.
- 12 Also the man that lieth with his daughter in law, they both shal

die the death, they have wrought ^abomination, their blood shal be upon them.

- 13 *The man also that lieth with the male, as one lieth with a woman, they have both committed abomination: they shal die the death, their blood shal be upon them.
- 14 Likewise he that taketh a wife and her mother, 'committeth wickedness: they shal burn him and them with fire, that there be no wickedness among you.
- 15 *Also the man that lieth with a beast, shal die the death, and ye shal slay the beast.
- 16 And if a woman come to any beast, and lie therewith, then thou shalt kill the woman and the beast: they shal die the death, their blood shal be upon them.
- 17 Also the man that taketh his sister, his father's daughter, or his mother's daughter, and seeth her shame and she seeth his shame, it is vileness: therefore they shalbe cut off in the sight ^of their people, because he hath uncovered his sister's shame, he shal bear his iniquity.
- 18 *The man also that lieth with a woman having her ^disease, and uncovereth her shame, and openeth her fountain, and she open the fountain of her blood, they shalbe even both cut off from among their people.
- 19 Moreover thou shalt not uncover the shame of thy mother's sister, *nor of thy father's sister, because he hath uncovered his ^kin: they shal bear their iniquity.
- 20 Likewise the man that lieth with his father's brother's wife, and uncovereth his uncle's shame: they shal bear their iniquity, and shal die gchildless.
- 21 So the man that taketh his brother's wife, committeth filthi-shal be childless.
- 22 ¶ Ye shal keep therefore all mine *ordinances and all my judgements, and do them, that the land, whither I bring you to dwell therein, *spue you not out.
- 23 Wherefore ye shal not walk in the manners of this nation which I cast out before you: for they have committed all these things, *therefore I abhorred them.
- 24 But I have said unto you, ye shal inherit their land, and I will give it unto you to possess it, even a land that ifloweth with milk and honey: I am the Lord your God, which have separated you from other people.
- 25 *Therefore shal ye put difference between clean beasts and unclean, and between unclean fowls and clean: neither shal ye ^kdefile your selves with beasts and fowls, nor with any *creeping* thing, that the ground bringeth forth, which I have separated from you as unclean.
- 26 Therefore shall ye be *holy unto me: for I the Lord am holy, & I have separated you from *other* people, that ye should be mind.
- 27 ¶ *And if a man or woman have a spirit of divination, or

sothesaying in them, they shal die the death: they shal stone them to death, their blood *shalbe* upon them.

Chapter 21

2 For whom the Priests may lament. 6 How pure the Priest ought to be, both in them selves and in their family.

And the Lord said unto Mosés, Speak unto the Priests the sons of Aarón, and say unto them, Let none be adefiled by the dead among his people,

- 2 But by his kinseman that is near unto him: *to wit*, by his mother, or by his father, or by his son, or by his daughter, or by his brother.
- 3 Or by his sister a bmaid, that is near unto him, which hath not had a husband: for her he may lament.
- 4 He shal not lament for the $^{\circ}$ prince among his people, to pollute him self.
- 5 They shall not make *bald parts upon their head, nor shave off the locks of their beard, nor make any cuttings in their flesh.
- 6 They shal be holy unto their God, and not pollute the Name of their God: for the sacrifices of the Lord made by fire, and the bread of their God they do offer: therefore they shalbe holy.
- 7 They shal not take to wife an whore, or done polluted, neither shal they marry a woman divorced from her husband: for such one *is* holy unto his God.
- 8 Thou shalt *santify him therefore, for he offereth the 'bread of thy God: he shal be holy unto thee: for I the Lord, which sanctify you, am holy.
- 9 ¶ If a Priest's daughter fall to play the whore, she polluteth her father: *therefore* shal she be burnt with fire.
- 10 ¶ Also the high Priest among his brethren, (upon whose head the anointing oil was poured, & hath consecrated his hand to put on the garments) shal not uncover his head, nor rent his clothes,
- 11 Neither shal he go to any ^dead body, nor make him self unclean by his father or by his mother.
- 12 Neither shal he go out of the ^hSanctuary, nor pollute the holy place of his God: for the ⁱcrown of the anointing oil of his God *is* upon him: I am the Lord.
- 13 Also he shal take a maid unto his wife:
- 14 But a widow, or a divorced woman, or a polluted, or an harlot, these shal he not marry, but shal take a maid of his own *people to wife:
- 15 Neither shal he defile his seed among his people: for I am the Lord which sanctify him.
- 16 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 17 Speak unto Aarón, and say, Whosoever of thy seed in their generations hath any blemishes, shal not preace to offer the bread of his God:
- 18 For whosoever hath any blemish, shal not come near: as a man blind or lame,or that hath "a flat nose, or that hath any "misshapen *member*,
- 1 a By touching the dead, lamenting, or being at their burial.
- 3 b For being married she seemed to be cut off from his family.
- 3 ^Ebr., he may be defiled.
- 4 c Only the Priest was permitted to mourn for his next kindred.

- 8 e You shall count them holy and reverence them.

- 11 Or, to the houses of the dead.

- 12 i For by his anointing he was preferred to the other Priests, and therefore could not lament the dead, lest he should have polluted his holy anointing.
- 14 k Not only of his tribe but of all Israel.
- 15 I By marrying any unchaste or defamed woman.
- 18 m Which is deformed or bruised.
- 18 n As not of equal proportion, or having in number more or less.

- 19 Or a man that hath a broken foot, or a broken hand,
- 20 Or *is* croke backt, or bleare eyed, °or hath a blemish in his eye, or be skirvie, or scabbed, or have *his* stones broken.
- 21 None of the seed of Aarón the Priest that hath a blemish, shal come near to offer the sacrifices of the Lord made by fire, having a blemish: he shal not preace to offer the Pbread of his God.
- 22 The bread of his God, *even* of the ^qmost holy, and ^rof the holy shal he eat:
- 23 But he shal not go in unto the ^sveil, not come near the altar, because he hath a blemish, lest he pollute my Sanctuaries: for I am the Lord that sanctify them.
- 24 Thus spake Mosés unto Aarón, and to his sons, and to all the children of Israél.

Chapter 22

3 Who ought to abstain from eating the things that were offered 19 What oblations should be offered.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto Aarón, and to his sons, that they be aseparate from the holy things of the children of Israél, and that they pollute not mine holy Name in those things, which they hallow unto me: I am the Lord.

- 3 Say unto them, Whosoever *he be* of all your seed among your generations after you, that ^btoucheth the holy things which the children of Israél hallow unto the Lord, having his uncleanness upon him, even that person shal be cut off from my sight: I the Lord.
- 4 *Whosoever also of the seed of Aarón is a leper, or hath a running issue, he shal not eat of the holy things until he be clean: and whoso toucheth any that is cunclean by reason of the dead, or a man whose issue of seed runneth from him,
- 5 Or the man that toucheth any creeping thing, whereby he may be made unclean, or a man, by whom he may take uncleanness, 'whatsoever uncleanness he hath.
- 6 The person that hath touched such, shall therefore be unclean until the even, and shall not eat of the holy things, ^except he have washed his flesh with water.
- 7 But when the sun is down, he shal be clean, and shal afterward eat of the holy things: for it is his ^food.
- 8 *Of a beast that dieth, or is rent with beasts, whereby he may be defiled, he shal not eat: I am the Lord.
- 9 Let them keep therefore mine ordinance, lest they bear *their* sin for it, and die for it, if they defile it: I the Lord sanctify them.
- 10 There shal no ^dstranger also eat of the holy thing, neither ^ethe guest of the Priest, neither shal an hired servant eat of the holy thing:
- 11 But if the Priest buy any with money, he shal eat of it, also he that is born in his house: they shal eat of his meat.
- 12 If the Priest's daughter also be married unto a 'stranger, she may not eat of the holy offerings.
- 20 o Or that has a web, or perle.
- 21 p As the shewe bread, and meat offerings.
- 22 q As of sacrifice for sin.
- 22 r As of the tenths and the first fruits.
- 23 s In to the Sanctuary.

- 13 Notwithstanding if the Priest's daughter be a widow or divorced, and have no children, but is returned unto her father's house, she shal eat of her father's bread, as she did in her *youth: but there shal no stranger can eat thereof.
- 14 ¶ If a man eat of the holy thing unwittingly, he shal put the fifte part thereunto, and give it unto the Priest with the hallowed thing.
- 15 So they shal not defile the holy things of the children of Israél, which they offer unto the Lord.
- 16 Neither cause the *people* to bear the iniquity *of their* htrespass, while they eat their holy thing: for I the Lord do hollow them.
- 17 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 18 Speak unto Aarón, and to his sons, and to all the children of Israél, and say unto them, Whosoever *he be* of the house of Israél, or of the strangers in Israél, that will offer his sacrifice for all their vows, and for all their free offerings, which they use to offer unto the Lord for a burnt offering,
- 19 Ye shal offer of your free mind a male without blemish of the beves, of the sheep, or of the goats.
- 20 Ye shal not offer any thing that hath a blemish: for that shal not be acceptable for you.
- 21 *And whosoever bringeth a peace offering unto the Lord to accomplish his vow, or for a free offering, of the beves, or of the sheep, his free offering shal be perfect, no blemish shalbe in it. 22 Blind, or broken, or maimed, or having a ^wenne, or skirvie, or scabbed: these shal ye not offer unto the Lord nor make an offering by fire of these upon the altar of the Lord.
- 23 Yet a bullock, or a sheep that hath any *member superfluous, or lacking, such maiest thou present for a free offering, but for a vow it shal not be accepted.
- 24 Ye shal not offer unto the Lord that which is bruised or crushed, or broken, or cut away, neither shal ye make *an offering thereof* in your land.
- 25 Neither of the hand of a stranger shal ye offer the bread of your God of any of these, because their corruption *is* in them, there is a blemish in them: *therefore* shal they not be accepted for you:
- 26 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 27 When a bullock, or a sheep, or a goat shal be brought forth, it shalbe even seven days under his damme: and from the eight day forth, it shalbe accepted for a sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord.
- 28 As for the cow or the ewe, ye shal not *kill her, and her young both in one day.
- 29 So when ye will offer a thank offering unto the Lord, ye shal offer willingly.
- 30 The same day it shal be eaten, ye shal leave *none of it until the morrow: I am the Lord.
- 31 Therefore shal ye keep my commandments and do them: for I am the Lord.
- 32 Neither shal ye *pollute mine holy Name, but I will be hallowed among the children of Israél I the Lord sanctify you,
- 33 Which have brought you out of the land of Egypt, to be your God: I am the Lord.

Chapter 23

2 The feasts of the Lord 3 The Sabbath. 5 The passover 6 The feast of unleavened bread. 10 The feast of first fruits. 16 Witsontide. 24 The feast of blowing trumpets. 34 The feast of tabernacles.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say unto them, The feasts of the Lord which ye shal call the holy ^assemblies, even these are my feasts.

- 3 *Six days ^shal work be done, but in the seventh day *shalbe* the Sabbath of rest, an holy ^convocation: ye shal do no work *therein*, it is the Sabbath of the Lord, in all your dwellings.
- 4 ¶ These are the feasts of the Lord, *and* holy convocations, which ye shal proclaim in their *seasons.
- 5 In the first month, *and* in the fourteenth *day* of the month at evening *shalbe* the Passover of the Lord.
- 6 And on the fifteenth day of this month *shalbe* the feast *of unleavened bread unto the Lord: seven days ye shal eat unleavened bread.
- 7 In the first day ye shal have an holy convocation: ye shal do no be servile work *therein*.
- 8 Also ye shal offer sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord seven days, *and* in the °seventh day *shalbe* an holy convocation: ye shal do no servile work *therein*.
- 9 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 10 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say unto them, When ye be come into the land, which I give unto you, and reap the harvest thereof, then ye shal bring a ^sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest unto the Priest.
- 11 And he shal shake the sheaf before the Lord, that it may be acceptable for you: the morrow after the ^dSabbath, the Priest shal shake it.
- 12 And that day when ye shake the sheaf, shal ye prepare a lamb without blemish of a year old, for a burnt offering unto the Lord:
- 13 And the meat offering thereof *shalbe* two ^etenth deals of fine flour mingled with oil, for a sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord of sweet savor: and the drink offering thereof the fourth part ^fof an Hin of wine.
- 14 And ye shal eat neither bread nor parched corn, nor ^green ears until the self same day that ye have brought an offering unto your God: *this shal be* a law for ever in your generations and in all your dwellings.
- 15 ¶ Ye shal count also to you from the morrow after the ⁹Sabbath, *even* from the day that ye shal bring the sheaf of the shake offering, seven ^Sabbaths, they shalbe complete.
- 16 Unto the morrow after the seventh Sabbath shal ye number fifty days: then ye shal bring a new meat offering unto the Lord.

- 17 Ye shal bring out of your habitations bread for the shake offering: they shalbe two *loaves* of two tenth deals of fine flour, *which* shalbe baken with ^hleaven for first fruits unto the Lord.
- 18 Also ye shal offer with the bread seven lambs without blemish of one year old, and a young bullock and two rams: they shal be for a burnt offering unto the Lord, with their meat offerings and their drink offerings, for a sacrifice made by fire of a sweet savor unto the Lord.
- 19 Then ye shal prepare an he goat for a sin offering, and two lambs of one year old for peace offerings.
- 20 And the Priest shal shake them to and fro with the bread of the first fruits before the Lord, *and* with the two lambs: they shalbe holy to the Lord, for the ⁱPriest.
- 21 So ye shal proclaim the same day, *that* it may be an holy convocation unto you: ye shal do no servile work *therein*: *it shal* be an ordinance for ever in all your dwellings, throughout your generations.
- 22 ¶ *And when you reap the harvest of your land, thou shalt not rid clean the corners of thy field when thou reapest, neither shalt thou make any aftergathering of thy harvest, *but* shalt leave them unto the poor and to the stranger: I am the Lord your God.
- 23 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 24 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, In the *seventh month, and in the first day of the month shal ye have a Sabbath, for the remembrance of *blowing the trumpets, an holy convocation
- 25 Ye shal do no servile work *therein*, but offer sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord.
- 26 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 27 The *tenth also of this seventh month shalbe a day of reconciliation: it shal be an holy convocation unto you, and ye shal humble your souls, & offer sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord. 28 And ye shal do no work that same day: for it is a day of reconciliation, to make an atonement for you before the Lord your God. 29 For every person that humbleth not him self that same day, shal even be cut off from his people.
- 30 And every person that shal do any work that same day, the same person also will I destroy from among his people.
- 31 Ye shal do no manner work *therefore*: *this shalbe* a law for ever in your generations, *throughout* all your dwellings.
- 32 This shalbe unto you a Sabbath of rest, and ye shal humble your souls: in the ninth *day* of the month at even, from °even to even shal ye ^celebrate your Sabbath.
- 33 ¶ And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 34 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say, *In the fifteenth day of this seventh month *shalbe* for seven days the feast of Tabernacles unto the Lord.
- 35 In the first day *shalbe* an holy convocation: ye shal do no servile work *therein*.
- 36 Seven days ye shal offer *sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord, and in the eight day shalbe an holy convocation unto you, and ye shal offer sacrifices made by fire unto the Lord: it is the Psolemn

assembly, ye shal do not servile work therein.

- 37 These are the feasts of the Lord (which ye shal call holy convocations) to offer sacrifice made by fire unto the Lord, as burnt offering, and meat offering, qsacrifice, and drink offerings, every one upon his day,
- 38 Beside the Sabbaths of the Lord, and beside your gifts, and beside all your vows, and beside all your free offerings, which ye shal give unto the Lord.
- 39 But in the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when ye have gathered in the fruit of the land, ye shal keep an holy feast unto the Lord seven days: in the first day *shalbe* a 'Sabbath: likewise in the eight day *shalbe* a Sabbath.
- 40 And ye shal take you in the first day the fruit of goodly trees, branches of palm trees, and the boughs of ^thick trees, and willows of the brook, and shal rejoyce before the Lord your God seven days.
- 41 So ye shal keep this feast unto the Lord seven days in the year, by a perpetual ordinance through your generations: in the seventh month shal you keep it.
- 42 Ye shal dwell in booths seven days: all that are Israelites born, shal dwell in booths,
- 43 That your posterity may know that I have made the children of Israél to dwell in shooths, when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.
- 44 So Mosés declared unto the children of Israél the feasts of the Lord.

Chapter 24

2 The oil for the lamps. 5 The shewebread 14 The blasphemer shalbe stoned. 17 He that killeth shalbe killed.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 aCommand the children of Israél that they bring unto thee pure oil olive beaten, for the light, to cause the lamps to burn continually.

- 3 Without the veil bof the Testimony, in the Tabernacle of the Congregation, shal Aarón dress them, both even and morning before the Lord always: *this shalbe* a law for ever through your generations.
- 4 He shal dress the lamps upon the *pure Candlestick before the Lord perpetually.
- 5 ¶ Also thou shalt take fine flour, and bake twelve *cakes thereof: two ctenth deals shall be in one cake.
- 6 And thou shalt set them in two rows, six in a row upon the pure table before the Lord.
- 7 Thou shalt also put pure incense upon the rows, that ^din stead of the bread it may be for a remembrance, *and* an offering made by fire to the Lord.
- 8 Every Sabbath he shal put them in rows before the Lord evermore, *receiving them* of the children of Israél for an everlasting covenant.
- 9 *And the *bread* shalbe Aarón's and his sons, and they shal eat it in the holy place: for it is most holy unto him of the offerings of the Lord made by fire by a perpetual ordinance.
- 37 q Or peace offering.

- 40 Or, of bows thick with leaves.
- 43 s In the wilderness, forasmuch as they would not credit Joshua and Caleb, when they returned from spying the land of Canaan.

- 10 ¶ And there went °out among the children of Israél the son of an Israelitish woman: whose father was an Egyptian: and this son of the Israelitish woman, and a man of Israél strove together in the host.
- 11 So the Israelitish woman's son 'blasphemed the Name of the Lord, and cursed, and they brought him unto Mosés (his mother's name also was Shelomíth, the daughter of Dibrí, of the tribe of Dan)
- 12 And they *put him in ward, til he told them the mind of the Lord.
- 13 Then the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying,
- 14 Bring the blasphemer without the host, and let all that heard him, *put their hands upon his head, and let all the Congregation stone him.
- 15 And thou shalt speak unto the children of Israél, saying, Whosoever curseth his God, shal ⁹bear his sin.
- 16 And he that blasphemeth the Name of the Lord, shal be put to death: all the Congregation shal stone him to death: aswel the stranger, as he that is born in the land: when he blasphemeth the Name of the Lord, let him be slain.
- 17 ¶ *He also that ^killeth any man, he shalbe put to death.
- 18 And he that killeth a beast, he shal restore it, ^beast for beast.
- 19 Also if a man cause *any* blemish in his neighbor: as he hath done, so shal it be done to him:
- 20 *Breach for breach, eye for eye, tooth for tooth: such a blemish as he hath made in any, such shalbe repaid to him.
- 21 And he that killeth a beast shal restore it: but he that killeth a man shalbe slain.
- 22 Ye shal have *one law: it shalbe aswel for the stranger as for one born in the country: for I am the Lord your God.
- 23 ¶ Then hMosés told the children of Israél, and they brought the blasphemer out of the host, and stoned him with stones: so the children of Israél did as the Lord had commanded Mosés.

Chapter 25

2 The Sabbath of the seventh year. 8 The Jubilee in the fiftieth year 14 Not to oppress their brethren 23 The sale, and redeeming of lands, houses and persons.

And the Lord spake unto Mosés in mount Sinái, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say unto them, When ye shal come into the land which I give you, the *land shal ^keep Sabbath unto the Lord.

- 3 °Six years thou shalt sow thy field, and six years thou shalt cut thy vineyard, and gather the fruit thereof.
- 4 But the seventh year shalbe a Sabbath of rest unto the land: *it* shalbe the Lord's Sabbath: thou shalt neither sow thy field, nor cut thy vineyard.
- 5 That which growth of it bown accord of thy harvest, thou shalt

not reap, neither gather the grapes that thou hast °left unlabored: for it shalbe a year of rest unto the land.

- 6 And the ^drest of the land shalbe meat for you, *even* for thee, and for thy servant, and for thy maid, and for thy hired servant, and for the stranger that sojourneth with thee:
- 7 And for thy cattle, and for the beasts that are in thy land shal all the increase thereof be meat.
- 8 ¶ Also thou shalt number seven ^Sabbaths of years unto thee, even seven times seven year: and the space of the seven Sabbaths of years will be unto thee nine and forty year.
- 9 °Then thou shalt cause to blow the trumpet of the Jubilee in the tenth *day* of the seventh month: even in the day of the reconciliation shall ye make the trumpet blow, through out all your land.
- 10 And ye shal hallow that year, *even* the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty in the land to all the finhabitants thereof: it shal be the Jubilee unto you, and ye shal return every man unto his ⁹possession, and every man shal return unto his family.
- 11 This fiftieth year shalbe a year of Jubilee unto you: ye shal not sow, neither reap that which groweth of it self, neither gather *the grapes* thereof, that are left unlabored.
- 12 For it is the Jubilee, it shal be holy unto you: ye shal eat of the increase thereof out of the field.
- 13 In the year of this Jubilee, ye shal return every man unto his possession.
- 14 And when thou sellest ought to thy neighbor, or byest at thy neighbor's hand, ye shal hot oppress one another:
- 15 But according to the number of years after the Jubilee thou shalt buy of thy neighbor: also according to the number of the years of the revenues, he shall sel unto thee.
- 16 According to the multitude of years, thou shalt increase the price thereof, and according to the fewness of years, thou shalt abate the price of it: for the number of *fruits doeth he sel unto thee.
- 17 Oppress not ye therefore any man his neighbor, but thou shalt fear thy God: for I am the Lord your God.
- 18 ¶ Wherefore ye shal obey mine ordinances, and keep my laws, and do them, and ye shal dwell in the land ^in safety.
- 19 And the land shal give her fruit, and ye shal eat your fill, and dwell therein in safety.
- 20 And if ye shal say, What shal we eat the seventh year, for we shal not sow, nor gatherin our increase?
- 21 I will ^send my blessing upon you in the sixth year, and it shal bring forth fruit for three years.
- 22 And ye shal sow the eight year, and eat of the old fruit until the ninth year: until the fruit thereof come, ye shal eat the old.
- 23 ¶ Also the land shal not be sold to be cut off *from the family:* for the land is mine, & ye be but strangers & sojourners with me. 24 Therefore in all the land of your possession ye shal ^mgrant a
- redemption for the land. 25 ¶ If thy brother be impoverished, and sell his possession, then

- 24 m You shall sell it on condition that it may be redeemed.

his redeemer shal come, even his near kinsman, and buy out that which his ^brother sold.

26 And if he have no redeemer, but ^hath gotten and found to buy it out,

27 Then shal he ⁿcount the years of his sale, and restore the overplus to the man, to whom he sold it: so shal he return to his possession.

28 But if he can not get sufficient to restore to him, then that which is sold, shal remain in the hand of him that hath bought it, until the year of the Jubilee: and in the Jubilee it shal come °out, and he shal return unto his possession.

29 Likewise if a man sel a dwelling house in a walled city, he may buy it out again within a whole year after it is sold: within a year may he buy it out.

30 But if it be not bought out within the space of a ful year, then the house that is in the walled city, shalbe stablished, ^pas cut off *from the family*, to him that bought it, throughout his generations: it shal not go out in the Jubilee.

31 But the houses of villages, which have no walls round about them, shalbe esteemed as the field of the country: they may be bought out again, and shal ^go out in the Jubilee.

32 Notwithstanding, the cities of the Levites, *and* the houses of the cities of their possession, may the Levites redeem ^at all seasons.

33 And if a man purchase of the Levites, the house that was sold, and the city of their possession shal go out in the Jubilee: for the houses of the cities of the Levites are their possession among the children of Israél.

34 But the field of the asuburbs of their cities, shal not be sold: for it is their perpetual possession.

35 ¶ Moreover if thy brother be impoverished, and 'fallen in decay with thee, thou shalt relieve him, and as a stranger and sojourner, so shal he live with thee.

36 *Thou shalt take no usury of him, nor vantage, but thou shalt fear thy God, that thy brother may live with thee.

37 Thou shalt not give him thy money to usury, nor lend him thy vitailes for increase.

38 I am the Lord your God, which have brought you out of the land of Egypt, to give you the land of Canáan, *and* to be your God.

39 ¶ *If thy brother also *that dwelleth* by thee, be impoverished, and be sold unto thee, thou shalt not compel him to serve as a bond servant,

40 *But* as an hired servant, and as a sojourner he shal be with thee: he shal serve unto the year of the Jubilee.

41 Then shal he depart from thee, *both* he, and his children with him, and shal return unto his family, and unto the possession of his fathers shal he return:

42 For they are my servants, whom I brought out of the land of Egypt: they shal not so sold as bond men are sold.

43 *Thou shalt not rule over him cruelly, but shalt fear thy God. 44 Thy bond servant also, and thy bond maid, which thou shalt have, shal be of the heathen that are round about you: of them

shal ye buy servants and maids.

45 And moreover of the children of the strangers, that are sojourners among you, of them shal ye buy, and of their families that are with you, which they begate in your land: these shalbe your 'possession.

46 So ye shal take them as inheritance for your children after you, to possess them by inheritance, ye shal use their labors for ever: but over your brethren the children of Israél ye shal not rule one over another with cruelty.

47¶ If a ^sojourner or a stranger dwelling by thee get riches, and thy brother by him be impoverished, and sell him self unto the stranger or sojourner dwelling by thee, or to the stock of the stranger's family,

48 After that he is sold, he may be bought out: one of his brethren may buy him out,

49 Or his uncle, or his uncle's son may buy him out, or *any* of the kindred of his flesh among his family, may redeem him: either if he can "get *so much*, he may buy him self out.

50 Then he shal reckon with his buyer from the year that he was sold to him, unto the year of Jubilee: and the money of his sale shalbe according to the number of *years: according to the time of an hired servant shal he be with him.

51 If there be many years behind, according to them he shal give again for his deliverance, of the money that he was bought for. 52 If there remain but few years unto the year of Jubilee, then he shal count with him, and according to his years give again for his redemption.

53 He shal be with him year by year as an hired servant: he shal not rule cruelly over him in thy ^ysight.

54 And if he be not redeemed thus, he shal go out in the year of Jubilee, he, and his children with him.

55 For unto me the children of Israél *are* servants: they are my servants, whom I have brought out of the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God.

Chapter 26

1 Idolatry forbidden. 3 A blessing to them that keep the commandments 14 The curse to those that break them. 42 God promiseth to remember his covenant.

Ye shal make you none idols nor graven image, neither rear you up any *pillar, neither shal ye set ^any image of stone in your land to bow down to it: for I am the Lord your God,

2 Ye shal keep my Sabbaths, and *reverence my Sanctuary: I am the Lord.

 $3\,\P$ *If ye walk in mine ordinances, and keep my commandments, and do them,

4 I will then send you arain in due season, and the land shal yield her increase, and the trees of the field shal give their fruit.

5 And your threshing shal reach unto the vintage, and the vintage shal reach unto sowing time, and you shal eat your bread in plenteousness, and *dwell in your land safely.

6 And I wil send peace in the land, and ye shal sleep and none shal make you afraid: also I ^wil rid evil beasts out of the land,

and the bsword shal not go through your land.

7 Also ye shal chase your enemies, and they shal fall before you upon the sword.

8 *And five of you shal chase an hundreth, and an hundreth of you shal put ten thousand to flight, and your enemies shal fall before you upon the sword.

9 For 1 will have respect unto you, and make you increase, and multiply you, and °establish my covenant with you.

10 Ye shal eat also old store, & carry out old because of the new.

11 *And I wil set my ^dTabernacle among you, and my soul shal not loath you.

12 Also I wil walk among you, and I wil be your God, and ye shal be my people.

13 I am the Lord your God which have brought you out of the land of Egypt, that ye should not be their bondmen, and I have broken the °bonds of your yoke, and made you go upright.

14 ¶ *But if ye wil not obey me, nor do all these commandments, 15 And if ye shal despise mine ordinances, either if your soul abhor my Laws, so that ye wil not do all my commandments, but break my 'covenant,

16 Then wil I also do this unto you, I wil appoint over you 'fearfulness, a consumption, and the burning ague to consume the eyes, and make the heart heavy, and you shal sow your seed in vain: for your enemies shal eat it:

17 And I wil set ⁹my face against you, and ye shal fall before your enemies, and they that hate you, shal reign over you, *and ye shal flee when none pursueth you.

18 And if ye wil not for these *things* obey me, then wil I punish you beyon times more, according to your sins,

19 And I wil break the pride of your power, and I wil make your heaven as iron, and your earth as brass:

20 And your 'strength shalbe spent in vain: neither shal your land give her increase, neither shal the trees of the land give their fruit

21 ¶ And if ye walk *stubbornly against me and wil not obey me, I wil then bring seven times mo plagues upon you, according to your sins.

22 I wil also send wild beasts upon you, which shal 'spoil you, and destroy your cattle, and make you few in number: so your high "ways shalbe desolate.

23 Yet if by these ye wil not be reformed by me, but walk stubbornly against me,

24 Then wil I also walk *stubbornly against you, and I wil smite you yet seven times for your sins:

25 And I wil send a sword upon you, that shal avenge the quarrel of my covenant: and when ye are gathered in your cities, I wil send the pestilence among you, and ye shalbe delivered into the hand of the enemy.

26 When I shal break the "staff of your bread, then ten women shal bake your bread in one "oven, and they shal deliver your bread again by weight, and ye shal eat, but not be satisfied.

27 Yet if ye wil not for this obey me, but walk against me stubbornly,

28 Then wil I walk stubbornly in *mine* anger against you, and I wil also chastise you seven times *more* according to your sins.

29 And ye shal eat the flesh of your sons, and the flesh of your daughters shal ye devour.

30 I wil also destroy your high places, and *cut away your images, and cast your carkeises upon the ^bodies of your idols, and my soul shal abhor you.

31 And I wil make your cities desolate, and bring your Sanctuary unto nought, and pwil not smell the savor of your sweet odors.

32 I wil also bring the land unto a wilderness, and your enemies, which dwell therein, shal be astonished thereat.

33 Also I wil scatter you among the heathen, and ^qwil draw out a sword after you, and your land shalbe waste, and your cities shalbe desolate.

34 Then shal the land enjoy her *Sabbaths, as long as it lieth void, and ye shalbe in your enemies' land: then shal the land rest, and enjoy her Sabbaths.

35 All the days that it lieth void, it shal rest, because it did not rest in your 'Sabbaths, when ye dwelt upon it.

36 And upon them that are left of you, I wil send even a faintness into their hearts in the land of their enemies, and the sound of a leaf shaken shal chase them, and they shal fele as fleeing from a sword, and they shal fall, no man pursuing them. 37 They shal fall also one upon an other, as before a sword, though none pursue them, and ye shal not be able to stand before your enemies:

38 And ye shal perish among the heathen, and the land of your enemies shal eat you up.

39 And they that are left of you, shal pine away for their iniquity, in your enemies' lands, and for the iniquities of their fathers shal they pine away with 'them also.

40 Then they shal confess their iniquity, and the wickedness of their fathers for their trespass, which they have trespassed against me, and also because they have walked stubbornly against me.

41 Therefore I will walk stubbornly against them, and bring them into the land of their enemies: so then their uncircumcised hearts shal be humbled, & then they shal willingly bear *the punishment of* their iniquity.

42 Then I wil remember my covenant with Jaakób, and my covenant also with Izhák, and also my covenant with Abrahám wil I remember, and wil remember the land.

43 "The land also *in the mean season* shalbe left of them, and shal enjoy her Sabbaths while she lieth waste without them, but they shal willingly suffer *the punishment of their* iniquity, because they despised my laws, and because their soul abhorred mine ordinances.

44 Yet notwithstanding this, when they shal be in the land of their

enemies, *I wil not cast them away, neither wil I abhor them, to destroy them utterly, *nor* to break my covenant with them: for I am the Lord their God:

45 But I wil remember for them the *covenant of old when I brought them out of the land of Egypt in the sight of the heathen that I might be their God: I am the Lord.

46 These are the ordinances, and the judgements, and the laws, which the Lord made between him, and the children of Israél in mount 'Sinái, by the hand of Mosés.

Chapter 27

2 Of divers vows, and the redemption of the same. 28 A thing separate from the use of man cannot be sold, nor redeemed, but remaineth to the Lord.

Moreover the Lord spake unto Mosés, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israél, and say unto them, If any man shal make a avow of a person unto the Lord, by bthy estimation,

3 Then thy estimation shalbe *thus*: a male from twenty year old unto sixty year old shalbe by thy estimation even fifty °shekels of silver, after the shekel of the Sanctuary.

4 But if it be a female, then thy valuation shalbe thirty shekels. 5 And from five year old to twenty year old thy valuation shalbe for the male twenty shekels, and for the female ten shekels. 6 But from a dmonth old unto five year old, thy price of the male shalbe five shekels of silver, and thy price of the female, three shekels of silver.

7 And from sixty year old and above, if *he be* male, then thy price shal be fifteen shekels, and for the female ten shekels.

8 But if he be poorer ethen thou hast esteemed *him*, then shal he present him self before the Priest, and the Priest shal value him, according to the ability of him that vowed, *so* shal the Priest value him.

9 And if *it* be a ^fbeast, whereof men bring an offering unto the Lord, all that one giveth of such unto the Lord, shal be holy.

10 He shal not alter it nor change it, a good for a bad, nor a bad for a good: and if he change beast for beast, then *both* this and that, which was changed for it, shal be ⁹holy.

11 And if *it be* any unclean beast, of which men do not offer a sacrifice unto the Lord, he shal then present the beast before the Priest.

12 And the Priest shal value it, whether it be good or bad: *and* as thou valuest it, *which art* the Priest, so shal it be.

13 But if he wil buy it again, then he shal give the fifth part of it more, above thy valuation.

14 ¶ Also when a man shal dedicate his house to be holy unto the Lord, then the Priest shal value it, whether it be good or bad, and as the Priest shal prize it, ^so shal the value be.

15 But if he that sanctified it, wil redeem his house, then he shal give thereto the fifth part of money more then thy estimation, and it shalbe his.

16 If also a man dedicate to the Lord any ground of his

inheritance, then shalt thou esteem it according to the 'seed thereof: an 'Homer of barley seed *shalbe* at fifty shekels of silver.

17 If he dedicate his field *immediately* from the year of Jubilee, it shal be worth as thou doest esteem it.

18 But if he dedicate his field after the Jubilee, then the Priest shal reckon him the money according to the years that remain unto the year of Jubilee, and it shalbe abated by thy estimation. 19 And if he that dedicateth it, wil redeem the field, then he shal put the fifth part of the price, that thou estemedst it at, thereunto, and it shal remain his.

20 And if he wil not redeem the field, but *the Priest* ksel the field to another man, it shalbe redeemed nomore.

21 But the field shalbe holy to the Lord, when it goeth out in the Jubilee, as a field separte from common uses: the possession thereof shalbe the Priest's.

22 If a man also dedicate unto the Lord a field which he hath bought, which is not of the ground of his inheritance,

23 Then the Priest shal set the price to him, as *thou estemest it, unto the year of Jubilee, and he shal give "thy price the same day, as a thing holy unto the Lord.

24 But in the year of Jubilee, the field shal return unto him, of whom it was bought: to him, I say, whose inheritance the land was

25 And all thy valuation shalbe according to the shekel of *the Sanctuary: a shekel containeth twenty gerahs.

26 ¶ *Notwithstanding the first born of the beasts, because it is the Lord's first born, none shal dedicate such, be it bullock, or sheep, *for* it is the "Lord's.

27 But if it be an unclean beast, then he shal redeem it by thy valuation, and give the fifth part more thereto: and if it be not redeemed, then it shal be sold, according to thy estimation.

28 *Notwithstanding, nothing separate from the common use that a man doeth separate unto the Lord of all that he hath (whether it be man or beast, or land of his inheritance) may be sold nor redeemed: *for* every thing separate from the common use is most holy unto the Lord.

29 Nothing separate from the common use, which shalbe separate from man, shal be redeemed, *but* °die the death.

30 Also all the tithe of the land *both* of the seed of the ground, *and* of the fruit of the trees is the Lord's: *it is* holy to the Lord.

31 But if a man wil redeem *any* of his tithe, he shal add the Pfifth part thereto.

32 And every tithe of bullock, and of sheep, *and* of all that goeth under the ^qrod, the tenth shalbe holy unto the Lord.

33 He shal not look if it be good or bad, neither shal he change it: els if he change it, both it, and that it was changed withal, shalbe holy, *and* it shal not be redeemed.

34 These are the commandments which the Lord commanded by Mosés unto the children of Israél in mount Sinái.
